REGENT SUKOHARJO,

- Considering: a. that the spread of *Corona Virus Disease 2019* tends to continue to increase and expand from time to time so that comprehensive strategies and steps need to be implemented in order to anticipate and accelerate handling of the impact of its transmission towards a new normal order;
- b. that with the stipulation of the Extraordinary Event of *Corona Virus Disease 2019* in Sukoharjo Regency, in order to anticipate and accelerate the handling of the impact of its transmission as intended in letter a, especially to move towards realizing a new normal order for a productive and safe society of *Corona Virus Disease 2019*, it is necessary to adopt regulatory policies organizing religious activities and social activities in places of worship;
- c. that in order to regulate the implementation of religious activities and social activities in places of worship as intended in letter b, guidelines are needed for their implementation;
- d. that in accordance with the provisions of Article 2 paragraph (1) of the Minister of Home Affairs Regulation number 20 of 2020 concerning the Acceleration Handling *Corona Virus Disease 2019* in the Regional Government Environment, Regional Governments need to take steps and handle the transmission of *Corona Virus Disease 2019*;
- e. that based on the considerations as intended in letters a, b, c and d, it is necessary to stipulate a Regent's Regulation concerning Guidelines for Organizing Religious Activities and Social Activities in Houses of Worship in Realizing a New Normal Order for a Productive and Safe Society for *Corona Virus Disease 2019* in Sukoharjo Regency ;

#### GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

#### article 1

In this Regent's Regulation what is meant by:

1. The region is Sukoharjo Regency.
2. Regional Government is the Regent as the organizing element of Regional Government which leads the implementation of government affairs which are the authority of the autonomous region.
3. The Regent is the Regent of Sukoharjo.
4. Regional Apparatus is the supporting element of the Regent and the Regional People's Representative Council in the implementation of Government Affairs which fall under the authority of the Region.

5. Camat is the sub-district head in Sukoharjo Regency.
6. Lurah is the Head of Subdistrict in Sukoharjo Regency.
7. The Village Head is a village government official who has and is obliged to ~~organize~~ **manage** his village household and carry out the duties of the Government and Regional Government.
8. A house of worship is a building that has certain characteristics that is specifically used as a place of worship for adherents of each religion on a permanent basis, excluding family places of worship.
9. *Coronavirus Disease 2019* hereinafter referred to *Covid-19* is an infectious disease caused by *Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome-Corona Virus-2*.
10. *Effective Reproduction Number* , hereinafter abbreviated as  $R_t$ , is the number of new cases infected by one infective case in a population that has partial immunity or after intervention.
11. Patients Under Supervision, hereinafter abbreviated as PDP, are:
  - a. People with Acute Respiratory Infections (ARI), namely fever ( $\geq 38$  oC) or a history of fever; accompanied by one of the symptoms/signs of respiratory disease such as: cough/shortness of breath/sore throat/runny nose/mild to severe pneumonia and no other cause based on a convincing clinical picture and in the last 14 (fourteen) days before the symptoms appeared had a history of travel or live in a country/region that reports local transmission.
  - b. People with fever ( $\geq 38$  oC) or a history of fever or ARI and in the last 14 (fourteen) days before symptoms appeared had a history of contact with a confirmed case of *Covid-19*.
  - c. People with severe ARI/severe pneumonia who require hospital treatment and there is no other cause based on a convincing clinical picture.
12. Persons in Monitoring, hereinafter abbreviated as ODP, are:
  - a. People who have fever ( $\geq 38$  oC) or a history of fever; or symptoms of respiratory system disorders such as runny nose/sore throat/cough and none other causes based on a convincing clinical picture and in the last 14 (fourteen) days before symptoms appeared, had a history of travel or lived in a country/region that reported local transmission.

- b. People who experience symptoms of respiratory system disorders such as runny nose/sore throat/cough and in the last 14 (fourteen) days before symptoms appeared had a history of contact with a confirmed case of *Covid-19*.

- 13. The Regional Revenue and Expenditure Budget is the annual financial plan of the regional government which is discussed and approved jointly by the Regional Government and the Regional People's Representative Council, and is stipulated in a Regional Regulation.
- 14. The Village Revenue and Expenditure Budget is a plan village government annual finances.

## CHAPTER II

### PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES

#### Section 2

- (1) This Regent's Regulation is to provide guidance in the implementation of core religious activities and social activities in places of worship in realizing a new normal order for a productive and Covid-19 safe society *in the Region*.
- (2) This Regent's Regulation aims to ensure that the implementation of core religious activities and social activities in places of worship during the *Covid-19* Pandemic in the Region continues to comply with health protocols, especially in order to prevent the spread of *Covid-19* and protect the public from the risk of its impact.

## CHAPTER III

### USE OF HOUSES OF WORSHIP

#### Article 3

In order to prevent the transmission of *Covid-19* in the region, places of worship that can be used to organize congregational/collective worship activities and social activities are based on conditions

epidemiology, one of which is shown in the *Effective Reproduction Number/ Rt* figures as well as real facts in the field regarding areas/environments that are safe from *Covid-19*.

## CHAPTER IV

### LOCATION CRITERIA FOR HOUSES OF WORSHIP

#### Article 4

- (1) The criteria for the location of places of worship that can be used for holding congregational/collective worship activities and social activities as intended in Article 3 are as follows: a. in villages/sub-districts within the sub-district area where there are no *Covid-19* cases; or

- b. in villages/sub-districts where there are no *Covid-19* cases in sub-district areas where there are *Covid-19* cases.

- (2) Criteria for the location of the use of places of worship for holding religious services for individuals or congregations/collectives and social activities as referred to in paragraph (1), are excluded for places of worship located on main roads, whether on State roads, Provincial roads and Regency roads.

#### Article 5

- (1) In determining the location to use a place of worship for holding congregational/collective worship and social activities, apart from basing it on the criteria as intended in Article 4, it also pays attention to epidemiological conditions and real facts in the field regarding areas/environments that are safe from Covid-19 as *intended* in Article 3.
- (2) Epidemiological conditions and real facts in the field regarding areas/environments that are safe from *Covid-19* as intended in paragraph (1), namely:
  - a. reduction in the number of positive cases during the last 2 (two) weeks from the peak (target < 50%);
  - b. reduction in the number of ODP and PDP cases during the last 2 (two) weeks from the peak (target < 50%);
  - c. reduction in the number of deaths from positive cases during the last 2 (two) weeks from the peak (target < 50%);
  - d. reduction in the number of deaths from ODP and PDP cases during the last 2 (two) weeks from the peak (target < 50%);—
  - e. reduction in the number of positive cases hospitalized during the last 2 (two) weeks from the peak target (target < 50%); —
  - f. reduction in the number of ODP and PDP cases hospitalized during the last 2 (two) weeks from the peak (target < 50%); —
  - g. increase in the number of recoveries from positive cases;
  - h. increase in the number of completed monitoring and supervision of ODP and PDP; i.
  - reduction in the incidence rate of positive cases per 100,000 population;
  - j. reduction in death rates per 100,000 population;
  - k. the number of specimen examinations increases for 2 (two) weeks;
  - l. *positivity rate* < 5% (of all samples examined, the positive proportion was only 5%);

- m. the number of beds in the isolation room at the referral hospital can accommodate up to >20% of the number of positive *Covid-19* patients ;
- n. the number of beds in referral hospitals can accommodate up to >20% of the number of ODP, PDP and *Covid-19* positive patients;
- o. Rt-Effective reproduction number <1 (as a triangulated indicator).

## CHAPTER V

## ACTIVITIES IN HOUSES OF WORSHIP

## Part One

## Religious Activities in Houses of Worship

## Article 6

Religious activities that can be carried out at home  
Worship is a core religious activity.

## The second part

## Obligations of the Management/Person in Charge of a House of Worship

## Article 7

- (1) The management or person in charge of a place of worship has the obligation to:
- a. prepare officers to carry out and supervise the implementation of health protocols in areas of places of worship;
  - b. carry out regular cleaning and disinfection periodically in areas of places of worship;
  - c. limiting the number of doors/ways in and out of places of worship to facilitate the implementation and monitoring of health protocols;
  - d. providing hand washing/soap/hand sanitizer facilities at the entrance and exit of places of worship;
  - e. providing temperature checking devices at the entrance for all users of places of worship;
  - f. carry out temperature checks for users of places of worship and if users of places of worship are found with temperatures > 37.5 0C (thirty seven point five degrees Celsius) and above after carrying out 2 (two) checks with a distance of 5 (five) minutes, users of places of worship not permitted to enter the area of the place of worship;
  - g. implement distance restrictions by providing special markings on the floor/chairs, a minimum distance of 1 (one) meter;

- h. regulate the number of congregants/users of places of worship who gather at the same time, to make it easier to maintain distance;**
- i. shorten the time for worship without reducing the provisions for perfection of worship;**
- j. post appeals for the implementation of health protocols in areas of places of worship in places that are easily visible;**
- k. make a statement of readiness to implement the specified health protocols; l. implementing special health protocols for visiting congregations coming from outside the house of worship;**
- m. there is education or understanding for the congregation to carry out their obligations in the house of worship and to continue carrying out other religious activities at home;**
- n. prevent the spread of *Covid-19* in places of worship; And**
- o. maintain the security of places of worship.**

### **Part Three**

#### **Obligations of People Who Perform Worship in Houses of Worship**

##### **Article 8**

**People who will carry out worship in places of worship have the following obligations:**

- a. the congregation is in good health;**
- b. believe that the place of worship used has a *Covid-19* safe certificate from the competent authority;**
- c. use a mask/face mask when leaving the house and while in the area of places of worship;**
- d. maintain hand hygiene by frequently washing hands using soap or *hand sanitizer*;**
- e. avoiding physical contact, such as holding hands or hugging;**
- f. maintain a distance between congregations of at least 1 (one) meter;**
- g. avoid staying for a long time in places of worship or gathering in places of worship, other than for mandatory worship purposes;**
- h. prohibiting worship in places of worship for children or elderly people who are vulnerable to contracting disease, as well as people with congenital illnesses who are at high risk of *Covid-19*; And**

- i. take part in the implementation of the protocol health in places of worship in accordance with provisions.

**Part Four**  
**Social Activities in Houses of Worship**

**Article 9**

- (1) Social activities that can be carried out at home worship is a marriage/marriage contract.
- (2) If a place of worship is used for social activities in the form of marriage/wedding contracts as intended in paragraph (1), in addition to the provisions as follows referred to in Article 7 and Article 8, the following provisions are also added:
  - a. ensure that all participants present are in good health;
  - b. limit the number of participants attending to a maximum of 20% (twenty percent) of the room capacity and must not exceed 30 (thirty) people; And
  - c. The meeting was held in the shortest possible time Possible.

**CHAPTER VI**  
**SUBMISSION AND PUBLISHING MECHANISMS**  
**LETTER OF HOUSE OF WORSHIP**  
**COVID-19 SAFE**

**Article 10**

- (1) To carry out core religious activities and social activities in a place of worship, the management or person in charge of the house of worship is required to submit a request for a certificate that the area/environment of the place of worship is safe from Covid- 19 to: a.
  - Regent, for places of worship that have a large capacity and the majority of the congregation or users come from outside the area/neighborhood; or
  - b. Head of sub-district, for places of worship whose user scope is at village/sub-district level.
- (2) The application as intended in paragraph (1) shall be accompanied by a statement letter on a stamp duty of IDR 6,000.00 (six thousand rupiah) containing readiness to implement the health protocols that have been determined. signed by the administrator or person in charge of the house of worship.

### Article 11

- (1) The Regent, in accordance with his authority as intended in Article 10 paragraph (1) letter a, before issuing a certificate that a place of worship is safe from Covid- 19, must first coordinate with the Regional Leadership Communication Forum, Religious Assemblies and related agencies in the Regency.
- (2) The sub-district head, in accordance with his authority as intended in Article 10 paragraph (1) letter b, before issuing a certificate that a place of worship is safe from Covid- 19, must first coordinate with the Sub-district Leadership Communication Forum, Religious Councils and related agencies in the Sub-district.
- (3) The Regent or Subdistrict Head in the context of coordination to issue a certificate that places of worship are safe from Covid-19, can carry out inspections of the location of the requested place of worship.

### Article 12

- (1) Issuance of a certificate that places of worship are safe from Covid-19, by the Regent or Subdistrict Head after fulfilling the provisions as intended in Article 11.
- (2) The format of the certificate for places of worship that are safe from Covid-19 issued by the Regent or Subdistrict Head as intended in paragraph (1) is as stated in Appendix I which is an inseparable part of this Regent's Regulation.

## CHAPTER VII

### MONITORING

### Article 13

- (1) Monitoring of the implementation of the use of places of worship for core religious activities and social activities that have received a certificate that the place of worship is safe from Covid-19, whether issued by the Regent or Subdistrict Head in accordance with the provisions stipulated in this Regent's Regulation, is carried out by the Acceleration Task Force , Prevention and Handling of Covid 19 at the village/ district level.
- (2) Results of monitoring carried out by the Cluster  
The tasks as intended in paragraph (1) are reported to the Regent through the Camat.
- (3) The format for carrying out monitoring as intended in paragraph (1) is as stated in Appendix II which is an inseparable part from this Regent's Regulation.

## CHAPTER VIII

## FUNDING

## Article 14

- (1) Funding for the implementation of tasks carried out by Regional government officials, Subdistrict governments and Village/ Subdistrict governments in implementing the implementation of core religious activities and activities social services in places of worship in realizing a new normal order for a productive and safe society *Covid-19* in the Region originates from:
- a. Regional Revenue and Expenditure Budget; b. Village Revenue and Expenditure Budget; and c. third party donations or other funding sources valid and non-binding.
- (2) Funding management in the implementation of core religious activities and activities Social activities in places of worship in realizing a new normal order for a productive and safe *Covid-19* society as referred to in paragraph (1) are carried out in accordance with the provisions of statutory regulations.

## CHAPTER IX

## ADMINISTRATIVE SANCTIONS

## Article 15

- (1) Violations of the provisions as intended in Article 8 are subject to sanctions in the form of:
- a. verbal warning;
- b. written warning; and/or
- c. mass dispersal.
- (2) Violations of the provisions as intended in Article 7, Article 9 and Article 10 paragraph (1) are subject to sanctions in the form of:
- a. verbal warning;
- b. written warning; c. closing places of worship for a certain period of time; and/or
- d. revocation of the certificate in accordance with its authority.
- (3) The imposition of sanctions for dispersal of masses as intended in paragraph (1) letter c and closure of houses of worship as intended in paragraph (2) letter c is carried out by the Civil Service Police Unit.

(4) In implementing the imposition of sanctions as referred to in paragraph (3), in order to maintain security and public order, the Civil Service Police Unit may cooperate with the Republic of Indonesia State Police Indonesia and the Indonesian National Army at level Region and/or sub-district.

Article 16

Apart from the application of administrative sanctions as intended in Article 15, if a criminal act occurs, it is processed in accordance with the provisions of the Legislative Regulations.

CHAPTER X

TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS

Article 17

A house of worship that has been used for activities Core religious and social activities prior to the enactment of this Regent's Regulation must comply with the provisions of this Regent's Regulation.

CHAPTER XI

CLOSING

Article 18

Regulation This Regent takes effect on the date of promulgation.

So that everyone is aware, this Regulation is ordered to be promulgated by placing it in the Regional Gazette of Sukoharjo Regency.
