GUIDELINES FOR DEVELOPING MILLENNIAL FARMERS

BY THE GRACE OF ALMIGHTY GOD

REGENT SUKOHARJO,

Considering:

- a. that in order to strengthen food security and accelerate economic recovery in Sukoharjo Regency, foster entrepreneurship in the agricultural, fisheries and forestry sectors, by encouraging the regeneration of farmers from the millennial group through an advanced, independent, modern, competitive and profitable agribusiness development concept approach, as well as utilization effective and efficient digital technology, as an effort to increase food production, raw materials for processing industries and export commodities, reduce the problem of limited employment opportunities and improve farmers' welfare;
- b. that for fostering entrepreneurship as intended in letter a, requires synergy between stakeholders through support for programs/activities, science and technology, facilities and infrastructure;
- c. that the synergy between stakeholders as intended in letter b requires continuous planning, implementation and monitoring guidelines;
- d. based on the considerations as intended in letters a, b, and c, it is necessary to stipulate a Regent's Regulation concerning Guidelines for the Development of Millennial Farmers;

DECIDE:

To stipulate : REGENT'S REGULATION CONCERNING GUIDELINES FOR DEVELOPING MILLENNIAL FARMERS.

CHAPTER I

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

article 1

In this Regent's Regulation what is meant by:

1. The region is Sukoharjo Regency.
2. The Regional Government is the Regent as an element the Regional Government administrator who leads implementation of government affairs which fall under the authority of the autonomous region.
3. The Regent is the Regent of Sukoharjo.
4. The Department of Agriculture and Fisheries is the Service Agriculture and Fisheries in Sukoharjo Regency.

5. Agriculture is the activity of managing biological natural resources with the help of technology, capital, labor and management to produce agricultural commodities which include food crops, horticulture, plantations and/or livestock in an agroecosystem.
6. Fisheries are all activities related to the management and utilization of fish resources and their environment starting from pre-production, production, post-production and processing to marketing which are carried out in a fisheries business system.
7. Farmers are individual Indonesian citizens and/or along with their families who do it farming in the fields of food crops, horticulture, plantations, and/or livestock.
8. Fish Cultivator is every person whose livelihood is cultivating freshwater fish, brackish water fish and seawater fish.
9. Millennial Farmers are Farmers aged 19 (nineteen) years to 39 (thirty nine) years, and/or farmers who are adaptive to technology.
10. Farming business actor is every person who carries out agricultural production facilities, processing and marketing agricultural products, as well as agricultural support services domiciled in the jurisdiction of the Republic of Indonesia.
11. The development of young entrepreneurial farmers is an effort to increase the competence of young farmers in accessing technology, capital, markets and management so that they become independent young entrepreneurial farmers who are innovative, creative, able to compete, have a global perspective and are professional.
12. *Off Taker* is a party in the business world that provides marketing guarantees for the production of millennial farmer program participants.

BAB II

SCOPE

Section 2

The scope of this Regent's Regulation includes:

- a. planning;
- b. implementation;
- c. cooperation;
- d. financing;
- e. monitoring, evaluation and reporting.

CHAPTER III

PLANNING

Article 3

- (1) The Regent implements the Millennial Farmer program in an effort to regenerate farming business actors from the millennial generation.
- (2) The objectives of the Millennial Farmer program as follows referred to in paragraph (1), namely:
 - a. availability of employment opportunities;
 - b. ensuring the availability of quality and competitive agricultural and fishery products; And
 - c. implementation of means of applying digital technology in the management and marketing of agricultural and fishery products.
- (3) The target of the Millennial Farmer program as referred to in paragraph (1) is the Sukoharjo millennial generation aged 19 (nineteen) to 39 (thirty nine) years who have the interest and ability to run a farming business, and have a vision to advance the world of agriculture .
- (4) The stages of implementing the Millennial Farmer program are:
 - a. acceleration stage from 2022 to Year 2024; And
 - b. development stage from 2024 to Year 2028.
- (5) Participants in the Millennial Farmer program as referred to in paragraph (1) are residents of the Region who meet the following requirements and criteria:
 - a. aged 19 (nineteen) to 39 (thirty nine) years and adaptive to technology;
 - b. Regional residents and domiciled in the Region;
 - c. have basic experience in agriculture;
and
 - d. show interest in farming.

CHAPTER IV

IMPLEMENTATION

Part One

Establishment of a Millennial Farmer Network

Article 4

- The formation of potential participants for the Millennial Farmer program is carried out to obtain data and information regarding interested parties which is carried out through the following stages:
- a. registration of potential participants;

- b. selection of prospective participants; And
- c. determination of participants.

The second part

Facilitation of Supporting Facilities and Infrastructure

Article 5

- (1) Facilitation of supporting facilities and infrastructure needed in the millennial farmer program includes:
 - a. facility support, namely assistance in providing seeds/ seedlings, veterinary medicine and agricultural machinery; And
 - b. infrastructure support, namely processing infrastructure fishery products.
- (2) Facilitation of supporting facilities and infrastructure as intended in paragraph (1) is carried out in order to stimulate the smooth implementation of the Millennial Farmer program.

Part Three

Millennial Farmer Training

Article 6

- (1) Training for Millennial Farmer program participants is carried out so that the farming business start-up process can run well and smoothly.
- (2) Millennial farmer training as referred to in paragraph (1) is aimed at increasing the chances of success in farming businesses that will be run by Millennial Farmer program participants.
- (3) The type of training is adjusted to the Millennial Farmer program participants' choice of business start-up interests.
- (4) Training for Millennial Farmers, including:
 - a. shallot cultivation training;
 - b. operator training and agricultural machine tool repair;
 - c. goat cultivation training;
 - d. fishery product processing training; And
 - e. training in marketing agricultural and fishery products through *the marketplace*.
- (5) Training methods for Millennial Farmers can be carried out through the approach:
 - a. counseling/socialization;
 - b. field schools/technical guidance/training; and
 - c. visits/assistance in farming businesses.

Part Four

Access to Farming Business Capital

Article 7

- (1) Banking assists the process of assisting access to capital for participants developing business processes.
- (2) Capital facilitation is carried out through:
 - a. credits from the People's Business Credit (KUR) program;
 - b. non-program credit from Ultra Micro (UMI)/Pawnshop;
 - c. Corporate Environmental Social Responsibility (TJSPLP)/Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR);
 - d. Community Development Partnership Program (PKBL); And
 - e. financing program.

Part Five

Farming Institutional Development

Article 8

- (1) In the context of developing farming businesses, Millennial Farmer program participants are given guidance on the growth and strengthening of business institutions farmers from the Agricultural Extension and Human Resources Development Agency (BPPSDMP), practitioners and academics.
- (2) The development of farming business institutions as referred to in paragraph (1) is carried out by each commodity and work management sector the same as elements of Regional Apparatus related to the Regional Government by involving resource persons for institutional development of farmers, namely Regional facilitators, agricultural instructors and village heads.

Article 9

The development of farming business institutions as referred to in Article 8, is intended to ensure the continued success of the development of the participants' farming businesses in the long term.

Part Six

Farming Product Marketing Assistance

Article 10

Farming business assistance and product marketing is carried out in stages:

- a. identification and verification of the quality of products produced by Millennial Farmer participants;
- b. assistance in establishing partnerships between Millennial Farmers and *Off Takers* based on work agreements the same;
- c. marketing process of participants' production; And
- d. evaluation of marketing of participant farming products.

Article 11

Assistance in the marketing of farming products as intended in Article 10, is carried out to ensure smooth marketing of participants' farming products and encourage business independence at the next stage.

BAB V

WORK TOGETHER

Article 12

- (1) The Regional Government develops a pattern of cooperation in implementing the Millennial Farmer program in accordance with statutory regulations.
- (2) Cooperation as intended in paragraph (1) is carried out with parties:
 - a. other local governments;
 - b. foreign government/business entity;
 - c. domestic business entity; and/or
 - d. community groups.
- (3) Cooperation as intended in paragraph (1) can be implemented with the Central Government with program synergy.
- (4) The form of cooperation as intended in paragraph (2) includes:
 - a. funding assistance;
 - b. expert assistance;

- c. assistance with facilities and infrastructure;
- d. education and training; And
- e. other collaboration as needed.

(5) The procedures and mechanisms for cooperation as referred to in paragraph (1) are guided by the provisions of statutory regulations.

BAB VI

FINANCING

Article 13

Funding for the Millennial Farmer program comes from:

- a. Regional Revenue and Expenditure Budget; And
- b. other legitimate sources in accordance with statutory provisions.

BAB VII

MONITORING, EVALUATION AND REPORTING

Article 14

- (1) The Agriculture and Fisheries Service coordinates monitoring, evaluation and reporting on the implementation of the Millennial Farmer network program.
- (2) Monitoring, evaluation and reporting as intended in paragraph (1) are carried out in order to measure the success of the implementation of the Millennial Farmer Network Program.
- (3) The Agriculture and Fisheries Service reports the results of monitoring, evaluation and reporting of the Millennial Farmer Network program periodically to the Regent.

BAB VIII

CLOSING

Article 15

This Regent's Regulation comes into force on the date of promulgation.

So that everyone is aware, this Regent's Regulation is ordered to be promulgated by placing it in the Regional Gazette of Sukoharjo Regency.
