REGENT SUKOHARJO,

Considering: that in order to implement the provisions of Article 8 paragraph (4), Article 33 paragraph (2), Article 39 paragraph (2), Article 50, Article 56 paragraph (4), Article 76, Sukoharjo Regency Regional Regulations Number 18 of 2017 concerning Persons with Disabilities, it is necessary to stipulate a Regent's Regulation concerning Instructions Implementation of Sukoharjo Regency Regional Regulations Number 18 of 2017 concerning Persons with Disabilities;

To stipulate: REGENT'S REGULATION CONCERNING INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF SUKOHARJO DISTRICT REGIONAL REGULATION NUMBER 18 OF 2017 CONCERNING PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

article 1

In this Regent's Regulation what is meant by:

1. The region is Sukoharjo Regency.
2. Regional Government is the Regent as the organizing element of Regional Government which leads the implementation of government affairs which are the authority of the autonomous region.
3. The Regent is the Regent of Sukoharjo.
4. Social Service is the Sukoharjo Regency Social Service.
5. The Regional Planning, Research and Development Agency, hereinafter referred to as Bappelbangda, is the Regional Planning, Research and Development Agency of Sukoharjo Regency.
6. Regional Apparatus is a Regional Apparatus which is an auxiliary element of the Regent and the Regional People's Representative Council

in the implementation of Government Affairs which fall under the authority of the Region.

7. Persons with Disabilities are any person who experiences physical, intellectual, mental and/or sensory limitations for a long period of time who, in interacting with the environment, may experience obstacles and difficulties in participating fully and effectively with other citizens based on equal rights.
8. Social rehabilitation is a re-functionalization and development process to enable a person to be able to carry out their social functions properly in community life.
9. Social security is an institutionalized scheme to ensure that people with disabilities can fulfill their basic needs for a decent life.
10. Social protection is a conscious effort to protect, protect and strengthen the rights of persons with disabilities.
11. Social empowerment is an effort to strengthen the existence of Persons with Disabilities in the form of climate development and potential development so that they are able to grow and develop into strong and independent individuals or groups of persons with disabilities.
12. Accessibility is the convenience provided for people with disabilities to realize equal opportunities.
13. Job training is a total of activities to provide, obtain, improve and develop work competence, productivity, discipline, attitude and work ethic at a certain level of skills and expertise in accordance with the level and qualifications of the position or job.
14. Social assistance is an effort to provide assistance to people with disabilities, in order to improve their social welfare.

CHAPTER II

SCOPE

Section 2

The scope of this Regent's Regulation includes:

- a. implementation of empowerment of persons with disabilities;
- b. coordination of protection for equal treatment in the field of employment; c. health services according to conditions and needs;

- d. coordinating the empowerment of people with disabilities in fields social;
- e. data;
- f. fulfillment of the rights and roles of persons with disabilities in the field disaster management; And
- g. awards.

CHAPTER III

IMPLEMENTATION OF EMPOWERMENT OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

Article 3

- (1) Regional Governments are obliged to carry out planning, implementation and evaluation of the empowerment of persons with disabilities.
- (2) To implement effective empowerment of persons with disabilities as referred to in paragraph (1), the Regional Government is obliged to formulate it in a master plan.
- (3) The master plan as intended in paragraph (2) is implemented in accordance with regional development planning documents.

Part One General

Article 4

Implementation of empowerment of persons with disabilities includes:

- a. planning;
- b. administration; And
- c. evaluation.

The second part Planning

Paragraph 1 General

Article 5

The process of preparing planning documents for fulfilling the rights of persons with disabilities goes through the following stages:

- a. evaluation of the implementation of fulfilling the rights of persons with disabilities disability;
- b. Regional Apparatus forums can involve Organizations of Persons with Disabilities to submit plans for implementing the fulfillment of the rights of persons with disabilities; And
- c. thematic development planning deliberations in the framework of fulfilling the rights of persons with disabilities.

Paragraph 2
Master Plan

Article 6

- (1) The Social Service prepares a Master Plan involving Regional Apparatus and Organizations of Persons with Disabilities.
- (2) The Master Plan is prepared with the aim of realizing sustainable inclusive community development in supporting the implementation of respect, protection and fulfillment of the rights of persons with disabilities.
- (3) The Master Plan as intended in paragraph (1) is regulated in a separate Regent's Regulation.

Paragraph 3
Regional Action Plan

Article 7

- (1) The Social Service with Regional Apparatus prepares a Regional Action Plan for Persons with Disabilities in line with the RPJMD.
- (2) The Regional Action Plan for Persons with Disabilities as intended in paragraph (1) is regulated in a Regent's Regulation separately.

Part Three
Maintenance

Article 8

- (1) Implementation of respect, protection and fulfillment of the rights of Persons with Disabilities constitutes responsibility of the Regional Government and the community.
- (2) The implementation as intended in paragraph (1) is based on regional planning and the Master Plan Persons with Disabilities.
- (3) Implementation can be carried out by mainstreaming disability issues in sectors or programs/activities that do not specifically target people with disabilities.

Part Four
Evaluation

Article 8

- (1) Evaluation of the implementation of empowerment for people with disabilities disabilities include:
 - a. control over the empowerment of persons with disabilities; And
 - b. evaluation of the empowerment of people with disabilities.
- (2) Evaluation of the empowerment of persons with disabilities as referred to in paragraph (1) letter d is carried out

by the Monitoring and Evaluation Team established by Regent's Decree.

CHAPTER IV
COORDINATION OF PROTECTION OF THE TREATMENT
EQUAL IN THE FIELD OF EMPLOYMENT

Article 10

Regional officials in charge of employment are obliged to coordinate the protection of workers with disabilities with employers with the aim of:

- a. ensuring people with disabilities have equal opportunities in the workplace; b. increasing employment opportunities for persons with disabilities by facilitating recruitment, guaranteeing return to work, guaranteeing continued employment in accordance with their competence and obtaining opportunities for advancement in level/ position;
- c. ensure a safe, accessible and healthy workplace; And
- d. ensure that there is equal health care and insurance payments between persons with disabilities and other employees.

Article 11

Coordinate with Employers who accept workers
Persons with Disabilities as intended in Article 10 are carried out in the form of:

- a. make necessary adjustments to the work environment, both system adjustments and the physical work environment;
- b. build initial communication with workers with disabilities disabilities especially in the initial phase of work incl providing sign language interpreters by employers;
- c. assistance in fulfilling proper accessibility for workers with disabilities; And
- d. assistance in holding sessions on how to interact with workers with disabilities in the work environment.

Article 12

(1) In order to ensure the implementation of coordination for the protection and equality of Persons with Disabilities, the Department of Industry and Manpower is obliged to establish a Disability Services Unit.

(2) The Disability Services Unit consists of at least 5 people from:

- a. Department of industry and labor;
- b. Employer; And

c. Disabled People's Organization.

- (3) The Disability Services Unit in the field of employment as intended in paragraph (1) is determined in the Regent's Decree.

CHAPTER V

HEALTH SERVICES ACCORDING TO CONDITIONS AND
NEED

Article 13

- (1) The Regional Government is obliged to provide health services for persons with disabilities.
- (2) Fulfillment of health services as intended in paragraph (1) includes:
- a. promotional;
 - b. preventive;
 - c. curative; And
 - d. rehabilitative.
- (3) Regional governments implement Health Insurance for Persons with disabilities who do not yet have health insurance in accordance with statutory regulations.
- (4) Regional apparatus in charge of the health sector provides accessible facilities and infrastructure, prepares Minimum Assessment Standards and Standard Operational Procedures for inclusive health services.

Article 14

Health service efforts in the form of promotional activities as intended in Article 13 paragraph (2) letter a include:

- a. dissemination of information about disabilities;
- b. dissemination of information about disability prevention;
And
- c. counseling about early detection of disabilities.

Article 15

- (1) Efforts to provide health services in the form of preventive activities as intended in Article 13 paragraph (2) letter b include efforts to prevent health problems given to people with disabilities during life.
- (2) The efforts as intended in paragraph (1) are carried out by creating a healthy living environment.
- (3) In order to create a healthy living environment as intended in paragraph (2), the participation of families of Persons with Disabilities, the community and Organizations of Persons with Disabilities is necessary.

Article 16

Health service efforts in the form of curative activities as intended in Article 13 paragraph (2) letter c are carried out through health service and treatment efforts.

Article 17

- (1) Health and medical services as intended in Article 16 are carried out through *home care* and mobile health centers which are carried out by health workers appointed in their work area.
- (2) Health services and treatment as intended in paragraph (1) must be in accordance with the medical indications of persons with disabilities.
- (3) Health services as intended in paragraph (1) must be provided by:
 - a. minimum service standards with a disability perspective;
 - b. quality care from professional health personnel;
 - c. active efforts by health workers to visit Persons with Disabilities who need health services according to medical indications;
 - d. need full support from family, community and sub-district social officer; And
 - e. the consent of Persons with Disabilities and/or their guardians for the medical procedures carried out.

Article 18

Rehabilitation health service efforts as intended in Article 14 paragraph (2) letter d are directed at re-functioning and developing the physical, mental and social abilities of people with disabilities and the community so that they can carry out social functions in accordance with their talents, abilities, education and experience.

Article 19

- (1) Efforts to provide rehabilitative health services in the health sector are implemented through *home care* at the Puskesmas.
- (2) Special rehabilitation services can be provided at regional public hospitals and private hospitals in accordance with medical indications and applicable regulations.
- (3) Health service efforts in the form of rehabilitative activities as intended in paragraph (2) are supported by full participation from the family and community.

- (4) Health service efforts in the form of rehabilitative activities as referred to in paragraph (4) can be through Community Resource Rehabilitation (RBM) activities and/or Inclusion Studio.
- (5) Medical rehabilitation can be carried out with integrated health services by health workers according to the level of health facilities, including:
 - a. doctor;
 - b. nurse;
 - c. psychologist;
 - d. *physiotherapist*;
 - e. occupational therapist;
 - f. speech therapist;
 - g. *orthotic-prosthetic*; And
 - h. medical social worker.

CHAPTER VI

COORDINATION OF EMPOWERMENT OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES SOCIAL FIELD

Part One General

Article 20

Coordination of empowerment of persons with disabilities in the social sector consists of:

- a. social rehabilitation;
- b. social Security;
- c. social empowerment; and D.
social protection.

The second part Social Rehabilitation

Article 21

Social rehabilitation takes the form of a community-based social service system.

Article 22

- (1) Social rehabilitation as intended in Article 21 provided by the Regional Government in the form of:
 - a. psychosocial motivation and diagnosis;
 - b. care and nurturing;
 - c. vocational training and entrepreneurship development;

- d. spiritual mental guidance;
 - e. physical guidance;
 - f. social guidance and psychosocial counseling;
 - g. accessibility services;
 - h. social assistance and assistance;
 - i. resocialization guidance;
 - j. further guidance; and/or k.
- reference.

- (2) Social rehabilitation as intended in paragraph (1) is carried out within the family and community through:
- a. socialization and increasing public awareness about people with disabilities; And
 - b. consultation and facilitation regarding the development of social abilities of people with disabilities.

Article 23

- (1) Social Services for Persons with Disabilities through a community resource system are carried out in collaboration with the private sector, the community and Organizations for Persons with Disabilities.
- (2) The target of community-based social services is aimed at people with disabilities and their families and public awareness.
- (3) Implementation of community-based social services for persons with disabilities is carried out through activities:
- a. increasing parental knowledge and awareness;
 - b. public awareness;
 - c. vocational and entrepreneurship training;
 - d. psychosocial guidance and psychosocial counseling;
 - e. stimulant package assistance;
 - f. physiotherapy and referral services;
 - g. joint venture groups; h.
- formation of village and sub-district groups of people with disabilities;
And
- i. inclusion studio.
- (4) Implementation of community-based social services for families of persons with disabilities as intended in paragraph (2) is carried out through:
- a. parenting and care guidance;
 - b. consultation and counseling;
 - c. vocational and entrepreneurship training;
 - d. stimulant package assistance; And

- e. reference.
- (5) Community-based social services as intended in paragraph (3) are implemented through the program:
 - a. social rehabilitation for Persons with Disabilities;
 - b. social rehabilitation for Persons with Disabilities ex chronic;
 - c. empowering families of children with disabilities;
 - d. empowerment of Village Disability Groups;
 - e. assistance for infrastructure and facilities for Joint Business Groups (Kube) for Persons with Disabilities;
 - f. entrepreneurship training for people with disabilities;
 - g. assistance for people with disabilities who are victims of natural/ social disasters; And
 - h. other programs in accordance with statutory regulations.
- (6) The Regional Government facilitates community efforts to fulfill the rights of persons with disabilities through training and/or meetings with Community Resource Rehabilitation cadres.

Part Three Social Security

Article 24

- (1) Social security is provided by the Regional Government for poor people with disabilities or those with low incomes.
- (2) Social security as intended in paragraph (1) is provided in the form of social welfare insurance, continuous direct assistance and special assistance.

Part Four Social Empowerment

Article 25

- (1) Social empowerment is carried out by the Regional Government through:
 - a. increasing the participation of Persons with Disabilities;
 - b. increasing family and community awareness regarding Persons with Disabilities;
 - c. increased will and ability;
 - d. exploring potential and resources;
 - e. extracting basic values; f. granting access; and/or g. providing business assistance.

- (2) Social empowerment as intended in paragraph (1) is provided in the form of:
- a. involvement in development planning forums
 - b. diagnosis and providing motivation;
 - c. training and mentoring;
 - d. administration of stimulants;
 - e. increasing access to marketing business results;
 - f. strengthening institutions and partnerships; g. further guidance; And
 - h. apprenticeship.

Part Five Social Protection

Article 26

- (1) Social protection is carried out by the Regional Government through:
- a. social assistance;
 - b. social advocacy;
 - c. legal aid;
 - d. assistance with infrastructure for Persons with Disabilities;
 - e. entrepreneurship training for people with disabilities; and/or
 - f. assistance for people with disabilities who are victims of natural and social disasters.
- (2) The Regional Government facilitates community efforts to fulfill the rights of persons with disabilities through Community Based Rehabilitation strategies.

Article 27

Social assistance as intended in Article 26 paragraph (1) letter a includes:

- a. Social Assistance for Underprivileged Communities;
- b. Life Insurance Assistance;
- c. Business Facilities Assistance;
- d. Productive Economic Enterprise Assistance (UEP);
- e. Joint Business Group Assistance (Kube); And
- f. Village Disability Group Assistance.

Article 28

Social advocacy as intended in Article 26 paragraph (1) letter b includes:

- a. assisting people with disabilities to obtain population documents;
- b. increasing the participation of groups of people with disabilities disability;
- c. providing motivation and social assistance;
- d. building shelters or safe houses for vulnerable groups;
And
- e. establishing an inclusive Standard Operating Procedure for handling victims of acts of violence.

Article 29

Legal assistance as intended in Article 26 paragraph (1) letter c includes:

- a. assistance for people with disabilities who are facing
by law; And
- b. coordination and assistance for persons with disabilities who are in conflict with the law to obtain appropriate accommodation.

Article 30

Infrastructure assistance for Persons with Disabilities as intended in Article 26 paragraph (1) letter d includes:

- a. mobility aids;
- b. providing accessibility in all public facilities; And
- c. infrastructure for inclusion studios.

Article 31

Entrepreneurship training for people with disabilities as intended in Article 26 paragraph (1) letter e includes:

- a. technical guidance for entrepreneurs with disabilities;
And
- b. skills training.

CHAPTER VII
DATA

Article 32

- (1) In order to implement social rehabilitation, social security, social empowerment and social protection, the Regional Government updates data on persons with disabilities.
- (2) Data on persons with disabilities as referred to in paragraph (2) is stipulated in the Regent's Decree.

CHAPTER XII
FULFILLMENT OF THE RIGHTS AND ROLE OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES
IN THE FIELD OF DISASTER MANAGEMENT

Part One
General

Article 33

- (1) The government implements disability-inclusive disaster management in an effort to fulfill the rights and roles of persons with disabilities in the pre-disaster, emergency response and post-disaster stages.
- (2) Implementation of disability-inclusive countermeasures as referred to in paragraph (1) includes the following aspects:
 - a. sort data;
 - b. accessibility;
 - c. participation;
 - d. capacity building; And
 - e. protection priority.
- (3) Implementation of disability-inclusive disaster management as intended in paragraph (2) is carried out through institutional systems at the Regional Disaster Management Agency and community-based institutional systems.

The second part
Institutional Systems in Regional Sector Apparatus
Disaster Management and Institution Based
Public

Article 34

- (1) Implementation of disability-inclusive disaster management through an institutional system is carried out by the Regional Disaster Management Agency which has activities and budgeting related to disaster management.

- (2) To implement the institutional system as intended in paragraph (1) the Regional Disaster Management Agency shall form a Service Unit.
- (3) Implementation of disability-inclusive disaster management through a community-based institutional system is carried out by institutions or organizations of people with disabilities, volunteer organizations, disaster risk reduction forums, and disaster management community groups.
- (4) The Regional Government through the Regional Disaster Management Agency facilitates support, capacity building and technical assistance for community-based institutions that carry out disability-inclusive disaster management.
- (5) Facilitation as intended in paragraph (4) is provided in the form of:
 - a. cooperation in disaster management activities;
 - b. capacity building;
 - c. preparation of plans related to mitigation disaster; And
 - d. development of educational media, information and early warning tools.

Part Three
Fulfillment of the Rights, Roles and Needs of Persons with Disabilities in
Implementing Disaster Management

Article 35

- (1) In order to fulfill the rights, roles and needs of persons with disabilities in implementing disaster management,

Government	Area via	Body
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Regional Disaster Management must:
 - a. providing accessibility;
 - b. involving persons with disabilities and/or organizations of persons with disabilities; And
 - c. provide disaggregated data.
- (2) Accessibility and involvement as intended in paragraph (1) letters a and b to develop independence in utilizing the abilities of persons with disabilities to fulfill the right to live with dignity, the right to humanitarian assistance and the right to protection and security.
- (3) The development of independence, empowerment and involvement as intended in paragraph (2) is carried out through capacity development for persons with disabilities and/or their organizations as well as for companions, families and communities in the environment of persons with disabilities.

- (4) The disaggregated data as referred to in paragraph (1) letter c is used to identify and understand the risks of persons with disabilities to disasters, plan and accommodate the needs for accessibility, participation, capacity building and protection priorities required for persons with disabilities.
- (5) Understand the risks of persons with disabilities against disasters as referred to in paragraph (4), relating to:
 - a. a person can receive and understand disaster management information and can act according to the information obtained independently;
 - b. someone can receive and understand disaster management information, but cannot act according to the information obtained independently or needs assistance;
 - c. and someone cannot receive and understand disaster management information and cannot act independently or needs assistance.

Article 36

Regional governments are required to have data on organizations of persons with disabilities as part of community-based institutions that can play a role in implementing disaster management.

Part Four Pre-Disaster

Article 37

Fulfillment of the rights, roles and needs of persons with disabilities in pre-disaster situations by referring to the 5 (five) disability inclusive aspects as intended in Article 33

in prevention, mitigation and preparedness activities, in the form of:

- a. involving persons with disabilities in preparing pre-disaster planning.
- b. socialization, formal and non-formal training, exercises, rehearsals and simulations;
- c. early warning systems, evacuation mechanisms, evacuation routes and evacuation gathering points that take into account the diversity of a person's functional limitations;
- d. preparation of training and evacuation facilities and infrastructure which is accessible; And
- e. involvement of persons with disabilities and their organizations in disaster risk reduction forums and volunteer groups as well as in the implementation of pre-disaster activities.

Part Five
Emergency response

Article 38

Fulfillment of the rights, roles and needs of persons with disabilities in emergency response to disability-inclusive aspects as intended in Article 33 in emergency response activities, in the form of:

- a. search and rescue activities,
- b. quick review,
- c. fulfillment of basic needs,
- d. distribution mechanism,
- e. emergency services,
- f. referral to hospital;
- g. management of evacuation and refugee camps; h. initial recovery activities in accordance with minimum service standards and functional limitations of persons with disabilities.

Article 39

Search and rescue of disaster victims and survivors must give priority to people with disabilities and be carried out in ways that are appropriate to their functional limitations.

Article 40

Rapid disaster assessments must use disability disaggregation data, involve people with disabilities and assess the fulfillment of the special needs of people with disabilities in disaster emergency response.

Article 41

Facilities and temporary housing take into account the convenience for persons with disabilities to carry out main household activities and livelihood-related activities.

Article 42

The provision of food assistance must be carried out in a timely and appropriate manner to minimize risks and improve the nutritional status, health and ability to survive of Persons with Disabilities.

Article 43

Fulfilling the need for clean water supply and sanitation must meet the special needs of persons with disabilities and their access to sources of clean water supply.

Article 44

The implementation of education in disaster situations must ensure that the education of students with disabilities continues in safe, protected conditions and pays attention to psychosocial aspects.

Article 45

Psychosocial assistance for Persons with Disabilities is provided according to the results of an assessment of the needs of persons with disabilities.

Article 46

- (1) Special tools and assistance for Persons with Disabilities are provided in accordance with the results of the needs assessment.
- (2) Special assistance as intended in paragraph (1) may take the form of therapeutic services to restore body function to normal.

Article 47

- (1) In disaster emergency response situations, it is mandatory to ensure that Persons with Disabilities affected by disasters are protected from acts of violence and coercion, and protected from being encouraged to act against their will and through fear.
- (2) In disaster emergency response situations, it is mandatory to ensure that property and assets belonging to disabled people who are disaster victims are safe from theft and control by other parties.

Article 48

Implementation of disaster emergency response involves persons with disabilities to provide input to the emergency response command, ensure that disability-inclusive services are provided by all emergency response clusters, and assist in implementing emergency response according to their capacity.

Part Six Post Disaster

Article 49

Fulfillment of the rights, roles and needs of persons with disabilities in the post-disaster period by referring to the 5 (five) disability inclusive aspects as intended in Article 34

in post-disaster activities, in the form of:

- a. post-disaster needs assessment;
- b. planning and implementing rehabilitation and reconstruction actions in the field of human development;

- c. housing and settlement;
- d. public infrastructure;
- e. productive economy;
- f. social; And
- g. medic rehabilitation.

Article 50

Post-disaster needs assessments must use disability disaggregation data, involve people with disabilities and assess the special needs for recovery of people with disabilities.

Article 51

Rehabilitation and reconstruction action planning must involve persons with disabilities to ensure inclusion in all rehabilitation and reconstruction sectors.

CHAPTER XIV

AWARDS

Article 52

- (1) The Regional Government may give awards to:
 - a. individuals or community groups who have contributed to the implementation of respect, protection and empowerment of persons with disabilities in the region;
 - b. giving awards to individuals, legal entities and state institutions that employ Persons with Disabilities in the regions; And
 - c. providers of public facilities that fulfill rights
People with Disabilities in the area.
- (2) Awards as referred to in paragraph (1) letter a for improving the standard of living and independence of persons with disabilities.
- (3) Awards as intended in paragraph (1) letter b who have employed people with disabilities more than 1% (one percent) for the private sector and 2% (two percent) for BUMD of the total workforce and provide adequate accommodation.
- (4) The award as intended in paragraph (1) letter c is given to service providers who provide easy accessibility in accordance with the principles of convenience, independence, safety and comfort for people with disabilities.

Article 53

- (1) Awards as intended in Article 52
based on the results of the assessment carried out by the Team
determined by the Regent's Decree.
- (2) The team as intended in paragraph (2) consists of:
 - a. Government elements by the Regional Secretariat, Social Services, Health Services, Education Services, Labor Services, Public Works and Spatial Planning Services;
 - b. private elements by universities; And
 - c. disabled people's organizations.

Article 54

- (1) Assessment as intended in Article 53
based on the following criteria, among others:
 - a. fulfilling the basic needs of disabilities which can reduce or alleviate poverty levels;
 - b. has a percentage of workers with disabilities that exceeds the statutory provisions;
 - c. equal treatment in the field of employment, and/or employment social security;
 - d. provision of accessible facilities and infrastructure, availability of SPM, ownership of inclusive SOP;
 - e. sustainability and continuity of programs and/or activities for empowering persons with disabilities; And
 - f. ownership of commitment to participation of persons with disabilities in carrying out activities.
- (2) The Regional Government can publish each award recipient to the public.
- (3) The form of award can be in the form of a fandel award certificate, publication trophy in the mass media and/or other forms.
- (4) Additional assessment criteria, determination of those entitled to receive the award and publication are further determined continued by Tim.

CLOSING

Article 55

This Regent's Regulation comes into force on the date of promulgation.

So that everyone is aware, this Regent's Regulation is ordered to be promulgated by placing it in the Regional Gazette of Sukoharjo Regency.
