REGENT SUKOHARJO,

**Considering: a. that Regional Governments need to preserve and develop customs and socio-cultural values
society to strengthen national identity, dignity, and foster national pride as well
strengthen national unity and integrity in the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia;**

b. that based on the provisions of Article 13 letter a of the Regulation

Governor of Central Java Number 32 of 2016 concerning Guidelines for the Preservation and Development of Customs and Socio-Cultural Values of the Community in Java Province Central, regulates Regency/City Governments in carrying out the preservation and development of community customs and socio-cultural values, formulating regulations regarding the Preservation and Development of Community Customs and Social-Cultural Values guided by provincial policies;

**c. that based on the considerations as intended in letters a and b, it is necessary to determine
Regent's Regulation concerning Guidelines for the Preservation and Development of Customs and Socio-Cultural Values of the Community in Sukoharjo Regency;**

DECIDE:

To stipulate: REGENT'S REGULATION CONCERNING GUIDELINES FOR THE PRESERVATION AND DEVELOPMENT OF COMMUNITY CUSTOMS AND SOCIO-CULTURAL VALUES IN SUKOHARJO DISTRICT.

PIG

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

article 1

In this Sukoharjo Regent's Regulation what is meant by:

1. The region is Sukoharjo Regency.
2. Regional Government is the Regent as an element of regional government administrators who leads the implementation of government affairs which fall under the authority of the autonomous region.
3. The Regent is the Regent of Sukoharjo.
4. Regional Apparatus is the supporting element of the Regent and the Regional People's Representative Council in the implementation of Government Affairs which fall under the authority of the Region.
5. A sub-district is a regional part of a district/city area led by a sub-district head.
6. Camat is the sub-district head in Sukoharjo Regency.
7. A village is a legal community unit that owns territorial boundaries that have the authority to regulate and manage government affairs, the interests of local communities based on community initiatives, origin rights and/or traditional rights that are recognized and respected in the government system of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia.
8. Sub-district is part of the sub-district as a sub-district apparatus.

9. Preservation is an effort to preserve and maintain the customs and socio-cultural values of the community concerned, especially ethical, moral and adab values which are the core of customs, customs in society and traditional institutions so that their existence is maintained and maintained. continues.
10. Development is a planned, integrated and directed effort so that the customs and socio-cultural values of society can develop following ongoing socio-cultural and economic changes.
11. Customs are a series of institutionalized and traditional behaviors in society which function to embody socio-cultural values in everyday life.
12. Socio-Cultural Values are idealistic conceptions about good, bad and right and wrong regarding the nature of human life in the scope of human relationships with the creator, fellow humans, nature, the dimensions of space and time and in interpreting the results of their work.
13. Community Institutions are institutions that are established by the community according to needs and is a partner of the village/ district government in empowering public.

CHAPTER II

PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES

Section 2

- (1) The preservation and development of customs and socio-cultural values of the community is intended to strengthen the identity of individuals, communities and traditional and cultural institutions in supporting government administration and community development in the region.
- (2) The aim of preserving and developing customs and socio-cultural values as intended in paragraph (1) is to support the development of customs and socio-cultural values in the region as one of the national cultural assets in order to achieve quality improvement national resilience and the integrity of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia.

CHAPTER III

SCOPE

Part One

General

Article 3

The scope of preserving and developing the customs and socio-cultural values of local communities includes:

- a. basic concepts;
- b. basic program;
- c. goal achievement strategies;
- d. method;
- e. the role of local government; and f. community participation.

**The second part
Basic concepts**

Article 4

The basic concepts as intended in Article 3 letter a include: a.

- recognition of cultural diversity and local wisdom to strengthen community identity and strengthen national culture;
- b. preserving, protecting and fostering the customs and socio-cultural values of communities in regions that are in harmony with development and modernization; c. fostering a spirit of togetherness and mutual cooperation that is rooted in the customs and socio-cultural values of the community; d. strengthening participation, creativity and independence local communities;
- e. growth and development of social capital based on community customs and cultural values;
- f. developing community commitment and awareness that upholds customs and socio-cultural values; And
- g. creation of regional conduciveness based on cultural heritage and noble socio-cultural values in the region that are in line with developments over time.

**Part Three
Basic Program
Article 5**

- (1) Basic program as intended in Article 3 letter b includes:
 - a. institutional strengthening;
 - b. increasing human resources; c. strengthening management; and D. exploration and development of customs and values socio-cultural.
- (2) Institutional strengthening as referred to in paragraph (1) letter a includes:

a. preparation of institutional strategic plans involving stakeholders; b. organizing traditional and socio-cultural institutions to ensure sustainability including: legal entity status, funding sources and organizational cadre formation in line with village regulations; c. orderly administration and operations are completed with Standard Operating Procedures (SOP); and D. monitoring and evaluation carried out periodically and in stages.

(3) Increase in human resources as intended in paragraph (1) letter b is implemented through:

a. tiered facilitation to regional officials (Regency/District, and Village); b. developing the capacity of regional officials in preparing programs and policies based on community culture; c. developing community capacity in conservation and development of community customs and socio-cultural values; And d. internalization of culture-based programs and policies community to regional and village government officials.

(4) Strengthening management as referred to in paragraph (1) letter c is implemented

by: a. methods for increasing institutional capacity, human resources and management of preserving and developing the customs and socio-cultural values of the community; b. procedures for implementing the preservation and development of customs and socio-cultural values of the community; and c. coordination mechanism for the implementation of the preservation and development of the community's customs and socio-cultural values.

(5) Program for exploring and developing customs and socio-cultural values as intended in paragraph (1) letter d through activities:

a. inventory and identification of customs and socio-cultural values of the community and its institutions that have the potential to be preserved and developed; b. study of social institutions, customs and socio-cultural values of the community which are deemed to contain local *wisdom* which is beneficial for the development of local communities; c. development of local *wisdom* into cultural packages that are easily actualized by community members; d. socialization and enculturation of customs and socio-cultural values through various educational media and public information; And

- e. maintaining positive norms, values and social systems in society through the institutionalization of forums actualization of community customs and socio-cultural values in regional and community strategic events.

Part Four
Achievement Strategy
Article 6

The strategy for achieving the objectives as intended in Article 3 letter c includes: a.

preparation of *blueprint* planning documents and road maps for the preservation and development of customs and socio-cultural values of the community at the district, sub-district and village levels involving the community and experts;

b. development/formation of cross-actor networks through strengthening cooperation between traditional institutions and developing cross-agency cooperation networks perpetrator;

c. development of coordination mechanisms between governments districts, sub-districts and villages/sub-districts with institutions of customs and socio-cultural values that are sustainable, effective and efficient; And

d. socialization and internalization of the customs and socio-cultural values of society and transforming them into contemporary socio-cultural values towards the creation of a civil society.

Part Five
Method
Article 7

Methods for preserving and developing the customs and socio-cultural values of regional communities

include: a. cultural experience (*cultural experience*);

and b. cultural knowledge (*cultural knowledge*).

Article 8

The *cultural* experience method as referred to in Article 7 letter a is a preservation method by carrying out concrete actions of participating directly in a particular cultural experience which includes:

- a. the formation of cultural institutions that encourage the process of passing on culture and its values to community members, especially the younger generation, can in the form of traditional arts training studios, Javanese language training institutions, pranatcara, and other forms that suit the needs of local communities;
And
- b. organizing festivals of customs and socio-cultural values as well as other cultural activities including: traditional sports, oral traditions, folk games, traditional technology, traditional knowledge, earth alms/village charity, so that community members can witness, engage in, and appreciate the culture of the people.

Article 9

The *cultural* knowledge method as stated in Article 7 letter b is used to preserve the customs and socio-cultural values of society by producing information-based cultural knowledge *through* various activities, including:

- a. inventory of customs and socio-cultural values and local wisdom that are realized, described and constructed in various forms of media, including print, audio, audiovisual and digital; And
- b. dissemination of the results of the inventory can be done carried out through local/extracurricular content subjects, exhibitions, film screenings, workshops, seminars, workshops or other activities
other.

Part Six

Regional Government Participation

Article 10

The regional government carries out the preservation and development of the customs and socio-cultural values of the people in the region.

Article 11

Regional governments carry out the preservation and development of the community's customs and socio-cultural values as intended in Article 10 by: a. prepare regulations regarding the preservation and development of customs and socio-cultural values of the community guided by district policy;

- b. foster community participation and creativity based on mutual cooperation and independence and justice;
- c. fostering solidarity in community relations in a real and measurable way under the motto "Bhinneka Tunggal Ika" to create a life of harmony, mutual respect and respect;
- d. coordinating the activities of vertical agencies in Regency/City, and Subdistrict, Village/Subdistrict in carrying out the preservation and development of customs and socio-cultural values of the community in Region; and
- e. provide guidance to the village/sub-district government in carrying out the preservation and development of the customs and socio-cultural values of the community in the area.

Article 12

- (1) The preservation and development of the customs and socio-cultural values of communities in the regions as intended in Article 11 is carried out by the Community and Village Empowerment Service and related Regional Apparatus.
- (2) The preservation and development of community customs and socio-cultural values as intended in paragraph (1) is carried out together with existing community institutions.

Part Seven

Community participation

Article 13

- (1) In order to facilitate and foster the preservation and development of customs and socio-cultural values of the community, working groups can be formed in the regions.
- (2) For the implementation of customary preservation and development customs and socio-cultural values of the community, Task Forces (Satgas) can be formed in sub-districts and villages/ sub-districts.
- (3) The community can participate in the preservation and development of customs and socio-cultural values.

Article 14

- (1) Community participation as intended in Article 13 paragraph (3) can be carried out by institutions or organization of customs and socio-cultural values of the community.
- (2)

- (3) Community participation as intended in paragraph (1) includes:**
- a. play an active role in instilling an understanding of diversity, strengthening national identity, fostering national pride, and strengthening national unity;**
 - b. play an active role in developing culture through dialogue, cultural gatherings, workshops, competitions, festivals and other activities; and**
 - c. provide input and assist the Regent in the preservation and development of customs and socio-cultural values.**

Article 16

- (1) Regional working groups as referred to in Article 13 paragraph (1) is stipulated by a Regent's Decree.**
- (2) The working group as intended in paragraph (1), consists of relevant technical officers, experts who have relevant expertise and community leaders.**
- (3) The task force as intended in Article 13 paragraph (2) in carrying out its duties can empower the community.**
- (4) The task force at the sub-district level as intended in Article 13 paragraph (2) is determined by a Sub-District Head Decree.**
- (5) The task force at the village/sub-district level as intended in Article 13 paragraph (2) is determined by the Decree of the local Village/Lurah Head.**
- (6) The task force at both sub-district and village/sub-district levels consists of relevant technical officers, cultural figures and community figures.**
- (7) Community participation as intended in Article 14 paragraph (1) is carried out in a coordinative and integrated manner with existing community empowerment programs with the principles of transparency, participation and accountability and reflects cultural values local existing and developing in the community.**

CHAPTER IV

GUIDANCE AND SUPERVISION

Article 17

- (1) The Regent coordinates the guidance and supervision of the preservation of customs and socio-cultural values across villages/subdistricts for the preservation and development of the customs and socio-cultural values of the community.**

- (2) The Regent can delegate to the Subdistrict Head the responsibility to coordinate cross-Village/Subdistrict guidance and supervision over the preservation and development of the community's customs and socio-cultural values.

CHAPTER V

REPORTING

Article 18

- (1) Reporting on the preservation and development of customs and socio-cultural values of the community is carried out regularly tiered starting from the village/sub-district level up to at the district level.
- (2) Reporting as intended in paragraph (1) includes:
- a. forms of activity; b.
 - goals and objectives of activities; c.
 - frequency of activities; d.
 - activity participants; e.
 - activity financial reports; f. activity
 - facilitator; g. necessary
 - infrastructure and facilities; h. obstacles faced
 - and solution strategies
 - problem;
 - i. indicators of activity success; and J. next
 - stage development plans.
- (3) Reporting as intended in paragraph (1) and paragraph (2) is carried out periodically every 6 (six) months and/or at any time if necessary.

CHAPTER VI

FUNDING

Article 19

Funding for the preservation and development of community customs and socio-cultural values can be sourced from: a. State budget; b. Provincial Regional Revenue and Expenditure Budget; c. Regional Revenue and Expenditure Budget; d. Village Revenue and Expenditure Budget; e. nongovernmental; and f. other legal and non-binding sources of funds.

CLOSING

Article 21

This Regent's Regulation comes into force on the date of promulgation.

So that everyone knows, order this Regulation to be promulgated by placing it in the Regional Gazette of Sukoharjo Regency.
