BY THE GRACE OF GOD ALMIGHTY

REGENT SUKOHARJO,

Considering: a. that the spread of *Corona Virus Disease 2019* in the world tends to increase over time, causing more casualties and material losses, and has implications for social, economic and community welfare aspects;

- b. that based on the provisions of Article 2 paragraph (1) of the Minister of Home Affairs Regulation Number 20 of 2020 concerning the Acceleration of Handling *Corona Virus Disease 2019* in the Regional Government Environment;
- c. that the Regional Government needs to take steps and handling the transmission of *Corona Virus Disease 2019* in at-risk community groups, especially pregnant women, through *rapid* tests at health facilities;
- d. that based on the considerations as intended in letters a, b, and c, it is necessary to stipulate a Regent's Regulation regarding Assistance for Rapid Test Examination Costs in the Implementation of the New Normal Order for Productive and Safe Corona Virus Disease 2019 for Pregnant Women.

DECIDE:

To stipulate: REGENT'S REGULATION CONCERNING ASSISTANCE WITH RAPID DIAGNOSTIC TEST AND POLYMERASE CHAIN REACTION EXAMINATION COSTS

ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE NEW NORMAL ORDER FOR PRODUCTIVE AND SAFE CORONA VIRUS DISEASE 2019 FOR PREGNANT WOMEN.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

article 1

In this Regent's Regulation what is meant by:

- 1. Region is Sukoharjo Regency;
- 2. Regional Government is the Regent as the organizing element of Regional Government which leads the implementation of government affairs which are the authority of the autonomous region;
- 3. Regional Apparatus is the supporting element of the Regent and the Regional People's Representative Council in the implementation of Government Affairs which fall under the authority of the Region;
- 4. Corona Virus Disease 2019, hereinafter referred to as Covid-19, is an infectious disease caused by Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome-Corona Virus-2;
- 5. Task Force for the Acceleration of Handling Corona Virus Disease 2019 hereinafter referred to as the Covid-19 Task Force, is a coordinating institution tasked with coordinating efforts to prevent and handle Covid-19 in the Region;
- 6. The Covid-19 pandemic is an event where the Covid-19 disease spreads which occurs globally throughout the world;
- 7. Close contact is someone who has physical contact or is in the room or visits with a patient case under supervision or confirmation within 2 (two) days before the case develops symptoms and 14 (fourteen) days after the case develops symptoms;
- 8. The transition period is a transition period towards a productive and safe new normal order in the *Covid-19 Pandemic*;
- 9. The period of a productive and safe new normal order is the period of implementing guidelines for implementing society towards a productive and safe new normal order in the *Covid-19 Pandemic*; 10. Pregnancy

Health Services are every activity and/or series of activities carried out from the conception period until delivery;

11. Rapid Diagnostic Test, hereinafter abbreviated as RDT, is initial screening method to detect antibodies, namely IgM and IgG, which are produced by the body to fight the Corona virus;

- 12. Polymerase Chain Reaction, hereinafter abbreviated as PCR, is a laboratory examination to detect the presence of genetic material from the Corona virus;
- 13. Health Social Security Administering Agency, hereinafter abbreviated as BPJS Health, is a legal entity established to administer health insurance programs;
- 14. Community Health Center, hereinafter referred to as Puskesmas, is a health service facility that carries out public health efforts and first-level individual health efforts, by prioritizing promotive and preventive efforts, to achieve the highest level of public health in its working area;
- 15. National Health Insurance, hereinafter abbreviated to JKN, is a guarantee in the form of health protection so that participants obtain health care benefits and protection in meeting basic needs provided to every person who has paid contributions/contributions paid by the government;
- 16. Health Service Cost Assistance is the Health Service Financing Assistance Program for Rapid test examinations for pregnant women in Sukoharjo Regency;
- 17. First level health services are non-specialist (primary) individual health services including outpatient and inpatient services;
- 18. Advanced level referral health services are specialized or sub-specialist individual health service efforts which include advanced outpatient care, advanced inpatient care, and inpatient care in special treatment rooms;
- Emergency medical health services are health services that must be provided immediately to prevent death, severity and/or disability in accordance with the capabilities of health facilities;
- 20. The health service referral system is the implementation of health services which regulates the reciprocal delegation of duties and responsibilities for health services both vertically and horizontally;
- 21. Medical action is a professional action by a doctor towards a patient with the aim of maintaining, improving, restoring health, or eliminating or reducing suffering;
- 22. Health service facilities, hereinafter abbreviated as health facilities, are tools and/or places used to provide health service efforts, whether promotive, preventive, curative or rehabilitative, carried out by the central government, regional government and/or the community;
- 23. Health Service Provider is a provider of health services at first and advanced levels;
- 24. Participants are pregnant women from poor and/or disadvantaged families who do not yet have health insurance who will undergo medical treatment at a health service facility.

CHAPTER II

SCOPE

Section 2

The scope of this Regent's Regulation includes:
a. Type of Health Service; b.
Membership of RDT and PCR Fee Assistance Recipients; c.
Health Service Provider; d. Health
Services Financing; e. Participants' Rights
and Obligations; and f. Rights and
Obligations of health service providers.

CHAPTER III

TYPES OF HEALTH SERVICES Article 3

- (1) Types of health services for pregnant women consist of:
 - a. RDT; And
 - b. PCR.
- (2) RDT and PCR services as referred to in paragraph (1) can only utilize inpatient service facilities at Puskesmas and inpatient treatment at class III hospitals; (3) RDT and PCR services as referred to in paragraph (1)
- follow the examination guidelines applicable in first-level health service facilities and hospitals.

CHAPTER IV

PARTICIPATION OF RDT AND PCR COST ASSISTANCE RECIPIENTS Article 4

- (1) RDT and PCR examination assistance is provided to pregnant women from poor and/or underprivileged families who do not yet have health insurance;
- (2) Pregnant women as referred to in paragraph (1) are pregnant women who will undergo medical *curatage*, birth assistance and/or obstetric surgery at a health service facility;
- (3) The medical action as intended in paragraph (2) constitutes inpatient health services.

CHAPTER V

HEALTH SERVICES PROVIDER

Article 5

- (1) Provider of health services at health service facilities is:
 - a. First level health service facilities owned by the Government namely Community Health Centers and their networks;

b. Non-government first level health service facilities that collaborate with the Health Service; and c. Advanced level health service

facilities, namely hospitals that collaborate with the Health Service.

CHAPTER VI

FINANCING HEALTH SERVICES

Article 6

- (1) Financing provided to pregnant women from poor and/or disadvantaged families who do not yet have health insurance includes:
 - a. RDT examination services at First Level Health Service Facilities are a maximum of Rp. 150,000.00 (one hundred and fifty thousand rupiah);
 - b. RDT examination services at Advanced Level Health Service Facilities, namely Hospitals, are a maximum of Rp. 150,000.00 (one hundred and fifty thousand rupiah);
 - c. PCR examination services at First Level Health Service Facilities are a maximum of IDR 1,300,000.00 (one million three hundred thousand rupiah); And
 - d. PCR examination services at Advanced Health Service Facilities, namely Hospitals, are a maximum of IDR 1,300,000.00 (one million three hundred thousand rupiah).
- (2) All costs arising from health services for recipients of health service assistance as intended in paragraph (1) are charged to the Regional Revenue and Expenditure Budget.

CHAPTER VII

PARTICIPANTS' RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS

Article 7

- (1) Pregnant women as intended in Article 3 have the right obtain RDT and PCR examination services in accordance with applicable regulations; (2) Pregnant
- women as intended in paragraph (1) are required to: a. complete administrative requirements; b. comply with service procedures at health service facilities;

 And
 - c. pay excess health service costs over what has already been paid determined.

Article 8

(1) Pregnant women who receive assistance for health care costs lose their rights if they wish to be treated in a higher class and choose a doctor and type of service not based on medical indications;

CHAPTER VIII

RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF SERVICE PROVIDERS

Article 9

- (1) Health service providers in health service facilities have the right to receive services and operational services in accordance with applicable regulations;
- (2) Health service providers at first-level health service facilities and advanced health service facilities are obliged to provide services according to standards, submit bills/claims and submit reports in accordance with applicable regulations.

CHAPTER IX

CLOSING

Article 10

This Regent's Regulation comes into force on the date of promulgation.

So that everyone is aware, this Regent's Regulation is ordered to be promulgated by placing it in the Regional Gazette of Sukoharjo Regency.
