MOTORIZED VEHICLE FREE DAY (*CAR FREE DAY*)

BY THE GRACE OF GOD ALMIGHTY

REGENT SUKOHARJO,

Considering:

- a. that in order to provide space the public, for people who are comfortable, healthy and free from motorized vehicles and to support efforts to control air quality and in order to realize environmentally conscious behavior, it is necessary to hold a Car Free Day ;
- b. that based on the provisions in Article 16 of Law Number 16 of 2004 concerning Roads, the Regency Government has the authority to administer district and village roads which includes regulation, guidance, development and supervision;
- c. that based on the considerations as intended in letters a and b, it is necessary to stipulate a Regent's Regulation regarding *Car Free Day*;

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

article 1

In this Regent's Regulation what is meant by:

1. The region is Sukoharjo Regency.
2. Regional Government is the Regent as the organizing element of Regional Government which leads the implementation of government affairs which are the authority of the autonomous region.
3. The Regent is the Regent of Sukoharjo.
4. Regional Government is the administration of Government affairs by the Regional Government and the Regional People's Representative Council according to the principle of autonomy and Assistance Duties with the principle of the widest possible autonomy within the system and principles of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia as intended in the 1945 Constitution of the Republic of Indonesia.

5. Regional Apparatus is the supporting element of the Regent and the Regional People's Representative Council in the implementation of Government Affairs which fall under the authority of the Region.
6. Car Free Day (*Car Free Day*) , hereinafter abbreviated as HBKB, is the day at the time Certain motorized vehicles may not be driven in areas/road sections that have been designated as locations for implementing HBKB.
7. Motorized Vehicle is any vehicle that is driven by mechanical equipment in the form of an engine other than a vehicle that runs on rails.
8. Street vendors are trading service business activities that occupy city infrastructure, social facilities and public facilities belonging to the Regional Government, land or plots belonging to individuals or bodies that have received permission from the Regent.
9. A sponsor is a person or company that undertakes (pioneers, initiates, proposes, organizes) an activity.
10. Participants are people, communities, agencies or business entities who take part or take part in events in the implementation of the HBKB.
11. Air Quality Measurement is an effort to measure air pollutant parameters at the HBKB implementation location.
12. Promotional Media is media used to carry out promotions such as banners, banners, billboards, flags, flyering, leaflets, brochures and the like.
13. *Force Majeure* is an event that occurs beyond human ability and cannot be avoided so that an activity cannot be carried out as it should.

CHAPTER II
PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES
Section 2

The purpose of enacting this Regent's Regulation is as a guideline for implementing HBKB so that it runs safely, orderly and smoothly.

Article 3

The implementation of HBKB aims to:

- a. providing public spaces for the community that are comfortable, healthy and free from motorized vehicles; b. supporting air quality control efforts; And
- c. realizing environmentally conscious behavior.

CHAPTER III
SCOPE
Article 4

The scope of this Regent's Regulation is:

- a. determining the location and time for HBKB implementation;
- b. participation in HBKB events;
- c. air quality measurements;
- d. visitor parking; And
- e. HBKB organizer, Duties and Authorities of the HBKB Team.

CHAPTER IV
LOCATION AND TIME OF HBKB IMPLEMENTATION
Article 5

(1) Determination of the location and time for HBKB implementation, taking into account the following criteria:

- a. the location has a fairly high traffic volume, so that the implementation of HBKB has a significant impact on efforts to restore/improve air quality;
- b. availability of alternative routes for other road users who usually pass along the road location in question, so that the accessibility required by other road users remains accommodated;
- c. served by public passenger transport; And
- d. is located in an area where land use is mostly for offices and/or trade.

(2) The HBKB implementation time is on Sunday from 06.00 WIB to 09.00 WIB.

(3) Determination of the location and time for implementation as intended in paragraph (1) and paragraph (2) is determined by a Regent's Decree after a trial is carried out first.

(4) Trial as intended in paragraph (3) implemented by the HBKB Team.

Article 6

(1) The implementation of HBKB can be canceled if:

- a. at the same time there are national and/or international activities or events at the HBKB activity location;
- b. coincides with national and/or religious holidays; and/or
- c. *Force Majeure* occurs .

(2) The elimination of HBKB implementation as intended in paragraph (1) is determined by the HBKB Team.

Article 7

- (1) Every person driving a motorized vehicle is prohibited from crossing the road designated as the location for HBKB implementation unless otherwise determined based on the Legislative Regulations.
- (2) The implementation of HBKB activities must be supported with:
 - a. the existence of alternative routes for diverting traffic flow;
 - b. the presence of traffic control and regulation (Gatur) officers;
 - c. the presence of cleaning staff;
 - d. the presence of officers administering public order;
And
 - e. availability of facilities and infrastructure.
- (3) In the event of an emergency and/or for acceptable reasons, motorized vehicles may cross the road designated as the location for HBKB implementation.

CHAPTER V

IMPLEMENTATION OF HBKB

Part One

General

Article 8

- (1) Implementation of HBKB consists of:
 - a. utilization of HBKB;
 - b. participant; And
 - c. Street vendors

The second part

Use of HBKB

Article 9

- (1) The HBKB implementation location can be used for activities with the following themes:
 - a. environment;
 - b. sport;
 - c. Art and culture;
 - d. education;
 - e. social;
 - f. trade for micro and small business actors;
And
 - g. public service.
- (2) HBKB is prohibited from being used for practical political purposes and issues related to Ethnic Religion, Interracial Race Group (Sara) as well as orations, invitations of a nature

Part Three
Conditions for Participants
Article 10

Participants can fill in activities in implementing HBKB with activity themes as intended in Article 9 paragraph (1).

Article 11

- (1) Requirements for participants who take part in activities in implementing HBKB, consist of:
- a. coordinate with the HBKB Organizer related to the implementation of activities;
 - b. submit a notification letter to the HBKB Organizer accompanied by:
 1. Participant identity; And
 2. Sponsors if any.
 - c. not organize activities or receive support from cigarette company sponsors;
 - d. obliged to maintain cleanliness, security and order during the implementation of HBKB;
 - e. Participants who will hold activities on a national and/or international scale are required to submit a request for permission to the Regent through the HBKB Organizer no later than 1 (one) month before the time of carrying out the activity.
 - f. Participants are not allowed to use generators in the HBKB area.
- (2) Participants who will take part in activities in implementing HBKB must go through the following stages:
- a. submit a letter of notification of participation in the HBKB Implementation to the HBKB Organizer, no later than 2 (two) weeks before the HBKB implementation;
 - b. the participant as the applicant must sign a Statement of Participation which contains the provisions and rules that must be adhered to in filling out the HBKB implementation event as stated in Appendix I which is an inseparable part of this Regent's Regulation;
 - c. The HBKB organizer can give a warning letter to participants if participants are found to have not complied with the rules for completing the HBKB implementation event, as stated in Appendix II which is an inseparable part of this Regent's Regulation.
 - d. for participants who receive a warning letter as referred to in letter c, and remain

If you commit a violation during the next HBKB implementation and/or based on the evaluation results of the HBKB Working Team, you will no longer be permitted to carry out activities in implementing the HBKB by being given a Black List Letter as stated in Attachment III which is an inseparable part of this Regent's Regulation.

- e. If participating in an activity causes a violation of order and destruction, the HBKB Team has the right to stop the activity.

Part Four

Provisions Against Street Vendors

Article 12

Street vendors can sell at locations determined by the HBKB Team.

CHAPTER VI

AIR QUALITY MEASUREMENT

Article 13

- (1) In order to determine the air quality at the HBKB implementation location, air quality measurements are carried out.
- (2) Air quality measurements as intended in paragraph (1) are carried out periodically.

CHAPTER VII

VISITOR PARKING

Article 14

HBKP visitor parking locations consist of:

- a. off-street parking locations; And
- b. parking locations in on-street spaces on Regency roads and Environmental roads around the area;

Article 15

The implementation of parking facilities is regulated in Regent Regulations.

CHAPTER VIII

HBKB TEAM

Part One

General

Article 16

- (1) In order to run the HBKB smoothly, an HBKB Team is formed consisting of Regional Apparatus and related agencies

among others :

- a. Sukoharjo Regency Transportation Service;
 - b. Sukoharjo Regency Trade, Cooperatives, Small and Medium Enterprises Service;
 - c. Sukoharjo Regency Communication and Information Service;

 - d. Sukoharjo Regency Environmental Service;
 - e. Sukoharjo Regency Youth and Sports Service;

 - f. Sukoharjo District Health Service;
 - g. Sukoharjo Regency Education and Culture Office;

 - h. Department of Public Works and Spatial Planning Sukoharjo Regency;
 - i. Sukoharjo Regency Social Service;
 - j. Sukoharjo Regency Civil Service Police Unit;
 - k. Sukoharjo Regency National Unity and Politics Office;

 - l. Subdistrict;
 - m. Subdistrict/Village; And
 - n. Sukoharjo Resort Police.
- (2) HBKB Team as intended in paragraph (1) determined by Regent's Decree.
- (3) The implementation of the HBKB Team as intended in paragraph (1) is coordinated by the Transportation Service.

The second part

Duties and Authorities of the HBKB Team

Article 17

The duties of the HBKB Team as intended in Article 5 paragraph (3) are regulated by a Regent's Decree.

Article 18

In carrying out the duties as referred to in

Article 17 The HBKB Team has the authority to:

- a. prohibit motorized vehicle drivers from passing through locations designated for HBKB activities;

- b. prohibit activities that cause motor vehicle exhaust emissions in locations designated for HBKB activities;

- c. carry out traffic arrangements around the location has been designated for HBKB activities;

- d. regulate the use of locations that have been determined for HBKB activities;

- e. prohibit community activities that could cause damage to public facilities and infrastructure at the HBKB location;
- f. coordinate with related agencies.

Article 19

The HBKB team as intended in Article 16, is obliged to convey information to visitors, participants and HBKB street vendors regarding the opening of roads at the activity location no later than 30 (thirty) minutes before the end of the activity implementation time.

CHAPTER IX

FINANCING

Article 20

The costs for implementing HBKB come from the Regency Regional Revenue and Expenditure Budget (APBD).

CHAPTER X

CLOSING

Article 21

This Regent's Regulation comes into force on the date of promulgation.

So that everyone is aware, this Regulation is ordered to be promulgated by placing it in the Regional Gazette of Sukoharjo Regency.
