REGENT SUKOHARJO,

Considering: a. that in order to provide an integrated mechanism for a comprehensive picture of disaster risk in Sukoharjo Regency and build capacity as well

culture of safety from disasters, analysis of threat level, level of loss and regional capacity;

b. that the study of disaster risk in Sukoharjo Regency was carried out to realize community security and protection against disasters, create a disaster-resilient community, and increase private sector awareness in Disaster Risk Reduction (PRB) efforts;

c. that based on the provisions of Article 6 paragraph (2) of Government Regulation Number 21 of 2008 concerning the Implementation of Disaster Management, disaster management planning is prepared based on the results of disaster risk analysis;

d. that based on the considerations as intended in letters a, b and c, it is necessary to stipulate a Regent's Regulation concerning Regional Disaster Risk Assessment;

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

article 1

In this Regent's Regulation what is meant by:

1. The region is Sukoharjo Regency.
2. Regional Government is the Regent as an element of regional government administrators who leads the implementation of government affairs which fall under the authority of the autonomous region.
3. The Regent is the Regent of Sukoharjo
4. The National Disaster Management Agency, hereinafter abbreviated to BNPB, is a non-ministerial government institution as intended in the Law on disaster management.
5. Regional Disaster Management Agency, hereinafter abbreviated as BPBD, is a Regional Government Agency that carries out disaster management in Area.
6. Disaster is an event or series of events that threatens and disrupts people's lives and livelihoods caused by both natural and/or non-natural factors and human factors, resulting in human casualties, environmental damage, property loss and psychological impacts.

7. Maintenance Countermeasures Disaster is a series of efforts that include establishing development policies that are at risk of disasters, disaster prevention activities, emergency response and rehabilitation.
8. Disaster Management Plan is a plan for implementing disaster management in a region within a certain period of time which is one of the bases for regional development.
9. Disaster-prone is the geological, biological, hydrological, climatological, geographical, social, cultural, political, economic and technological conditions or characteristics of an area for a certain period of time which reduce the ability to prevent, reduce, achieve preparedness and reduce the ability to respond. harmful effects
certain.
10. Disaster risk is the potential loss arising from a disaster in an area and a certain period of time which can be in the form of death, injury, illness, life at risk, loss of a sense of security, displacement, damage or loss of property, and disruption of community activities.
11. Disaster victims are people or groups of people who suffer or die as a result of a disaster.
12. Vulnerability is a condition of a community or society that leads to or causes inability to face the threat of disaster.
13. Preparedness is a series of activities carried out to anticipate disasters through organization and appropriate and effective steps.
14. Disaster Risk Assessment is an integrated mechanism to provide a comprehensive picture of a region's disaster risk by analyzing the level of threat, level of loss and regional capacity.
15. A map is a collection of points, lines and areas defined by their location with a certain coordinate system and by their non-spatial attributes.
16. Disaster Risk Map is a spatial and non-spatial description of the level of disaster risk in a region based on the Disaster Risk Study of a Region.

17. *Ground check* is a mechanism for revising virtual lines made on maps based on calculations and assumptions regarding actual conditions.
18. *Geographic Information System*, hereinafter abbreviated to GIS, is a system for managing, storing, processing or manipulating, analyzing and displaying data where the data is spatially related to the surface.

19. Capacity is the ability of regions and communities to take action to reduce the level of threat and level of loss due to disasters.
20. Loss Level is the potential loss that may arise due to the destruction of critical facilities, public facilities and residential homes in certain high altitude zones due to disasters.
21. Risk Level is a comparison between the Loss Level and Regional Capacity to minimize the Loss Level and Threat Level due to disasters.

Section 2

- (1) This Regent's Regulation is intended as a basis disaster management planning in the Region.
- (2) This Regent's Regulation aims to:
 - a. provide adequate guidance for internal regions
assess the risk of each disaster in the region;
 - b. optimize the implementation of disaster management in the Region by focusing on treating several risk parameters on a clear and measurable basis; And
 - c. harmonize disaster management implementation policies between the central, provincial and district/city governments with a unified goal.

CHAPTER II

POTENTIAL DISASTER

Article 3

Potential Disasters in the Region consist of:

- a. flood; b. extreme weather; c. earthquake; d. forest and land fires; e. drought; f. landslide; and/or
- g. epidemic.

CHAPTER III

DISASTER RISK ASSESSMENT

Article 4

(1) Disaster risk assessment aspects are based on:

- a. threat level; b. level of vulnerability; and c. capacity level.

(2) The disaster risk assessment as intended in paragraph (1) is used as a basis for preparing Disaster Risk Maps and disaster management planning.
