**REGENT SUKOHARJO,**

**Considering:**

- a. that street vendors as one of the people's economic business actors who operate in the informal sector trading business need to be empowered to improve and develop their business;**
- b. that the increase in the number of street vendors in the area has had an impact on the aesthetics, cleanliness and function of urban area facilities and infrastructure as well as disrupting the smooth flow of traffic, so it is necessary to organize and provide guidance;**
- c. that based on the considerations as intended in letters a and b, it is necessary to stipulate a Regent's Regulation concerning the Arrangement and Development of Street Vendors on Jalan Jenderal Sudirman, Sukoharjo Regency;**

**Determine: ARRANGEMENT AND DEVELOPMENT OF STREET VENDORS IN THE SECTION JENDERAL SUDIRMAN ROAD SUKOHARJO DISTRICT**

**PIG  
GENERAL REQUIREMENTS**

**article 1**

In this Regent's regulation what is meant by: 1.

Region is Sukoharjo Regency.

2. Regional Government is the Regional Head as the organizing element of the Regional Government who leads the implementation of Government affairs which fall under the authority of the Autonomous Region.

3. The Regent is the Regent of Sukoharjo.

4. The appointed official is a Regional Apparatus Organization official who has the authority to develop street vendors in accordance with applicable laws and regulations.

5. Street vendors, hereinafter abbreviated as PKL, are business actors who carry out trading business using movable or immovable business facilities, using city infrastructure, social facilities, public facilities, land and buildings belonging to the government and/or the private sector which are temporary/not stay.

6. Arranging street vendors is an effort carried out by the Regional Government through determining target locations to determine, move, control and eliminate street vendor locations by taking into account public, social, aesthetic, health, economic, security, order, and public interests.  
environmental cleanliness and in accordance with statutory regulations.



7. Empowering street vendors is an effort carried out by the government, regional government, business world and society synergistically in the form of growing the business climate and business development of street vendors so that they are able to grow and develop both the quality and quantity of their business.
8. A PKL location is a place to run a PKL business located on land and/or buildings owned by the regional government and/or private sector.
9. A target location is a location that has been designated for street vendors which is regulated by the regional government, either permanently or temporarily.
10. Business Registration Certificate, hereinafter referred to as TDU, is a letter issued by an appointed official as proof of registration of a PKL business as well as a control tool for empowering and developing PKL businesses in locations determined by the regional government.
11. PKL business facilities and infrastructure are tools or equipment used by PKL to store traded goods that are easy to move and disassemble, for example carts equipped with wheels.

## CHAPTER II

## SCOPE AND OBJECTIVES

## Section 2

The scope of regulation in this Regent's Regulation includes: 1. Arrangement; 2. Registration; 3. Street vendors' rights; 4. Obligations of street vendors; 5. Prohibition of street vendors' business premises; 6. Revocation of TDU; 7. Development, implementation and supervision; and 8. Transitional provisions.

## Article 3

The objectives of structuring and coaching street vendors are: a. provide business opportunities for street vendors through determining the location according to its intended purpose; b. grow and develop street vendors' business capabilities become an independent microeconomic enterprise; c. realizing a clean, beautiful, orderly and safe city with adequate and environmentally friendly urban facilities and infrastructure; and D. able to become a tourism attraction for Sukoharjo Regency so that it can increase local revenue (PAD) and community welfare.



CHAPTER III  
**SETTING**

**Part One**  
**Location Determination**

**Article 4**

- (1) **Location of PKL Business as intended by Regent's Regulations**  
This is on Jalan Jenderal Sudirman.
- (2) **The location as intended in paragraph (1) is on a part of the road that does not disrupt the function of the road.**
- (3) **Location of PKL Business as intended in paragraph (1)**  
located on the sidewalk of Jalan Jenderal Sudirman east of the north of the PT Bank Jateng Sukoharjo Branch office to Dukuh Dompilan or in front of Puri Lestari Housing Complex.
- (4) **The location arrangements as referred to in paragraph (1) are in accordance with the zoning of the place as in Attachment I to this Regent's Regulation**

**The second part**  
**Time and Type of Business**

**Article 5**

- (1) **PKL business hours start from 16.00 to 04.30 WIB.**
- (2) **The type of business traded is food and beverage.**

**Part Three**  
**Facilities and infrastructure**

**Article 6**

- (1) **Facilities and infrastructure for PKL businesses on Jalan Jenderal Sudirman as intended in Article 4 paragraph (1) include tents with a dismantling system, chairs, tables, trash cans and carts equipped with wheels.**
- (2) **Location Plan and Infrastructure as referred to in paragraph (1) are in Attachment II to this Regent's Regulation.**

CHAPTER IV  
**REGISTRATION**

**Article 7**

- (1) **Every person who carries out PKL business on the sidewalk as intended in Article 4 paragraph (3) is required to have a TDU.**
- (2) **The TDU application as intended in paragraph (1) is submitted to the Head of the Sukoharjo Regency Civil Service Police Unit.**



(3) Requirements for obtaining TDU as referred to in paragraph (2) is as follows: a. Valid Resident Identity Card (KTP); b. Recent color photographs measuring 2 x 3 cm, 4 (four) pieces; c. A statement letter containing: 1. Will not trade merchandise other than

food -drink; 2. Will not transfer TDU to other parties; and 3. Will not claim compensation in any form if the location in question is at any time needed by the Regional Government.

(4) The TDU is made in 3 (three) copies, the first copy is for the relevant PKL, the second copy is for the Sukoharjo Regency Civil Service Police Unit, the third copy is for a copy to the Department of Trade, Cooperatives, Small and Medium Enterprises.

(5) TDU is issued no later than 7 (seven) working days from the date it is received completely and correctly.

(6) Issuance of TDU is free of charge.

(7) TDU must always be placed in a business place that is easily seen and read by the public.

(8) The TDU is valid as long as the PKL carries out its business.

(9) The format of the TDU and statement letter as intended in paragraph (3) letter c is in Attachment III to this Regent's Regulation.

#### CHAPTER V PKL RIGHTS

##### Article 8

In carrying out their business, every street vendor has the right: 1. to receive registration services; 2. occupy a trading location according to the TDU owned; and 3. receive guidance from the Regional Government.

#### CHAPTER VI OBLIGATIONS OF PKL

##### Article 9

In carrying out their business, street vendors are required to: a. occupy a designated or permitted location; b. pay taxes and levies according to the provisions valid;

c. maintain and/or be responsible for the business premises and its surroundings so that at all times they are always clean, healthy, neat, beautiful, orderly and safe;

d. not sell/vacate/return/hand over the location of a street vendor's business to the Regional Government if the location in question is required at any time by the Regional Government without asking for compensation in any form;



- e. providing business merchandise, safety equipment/light fire extinguishers (in the form of sand/sacks jute), organic and inorganic waste bins; and f. Guide the provisions that apply in each creation of business premises.

## CHAPTER VII

## PROHIBITION OF PKL BUSINESS PLACES

## Article 10

- In carrying out their business, street vendors are prohibited from:
1. building permanent/semi-permanent buildings at the location business;
  2. have a food and beverage business in that location  
The same;
  3. leave infrastructure and facilities at the location after selling;
  4. use other public places or facilities outside the location which has been determined;
  5. change the shape and size of the tent that has been determined;
  6. buying and selling, renting and/or transferring business location anywhere; And
  7. Connect and tie tent ropes and business activity equipment to trees, fences and other public facilities.

## CHAPTER VIII

## REVOCATION OF TDU

## Article 11

- (1) TDU can be revoked if:
- a. TDU holders violate the provisions as regulated in Article 9 and Article 10;
  - b. the place of business in question is no longer specified as a street vendor business;
  - c. the business premises in question have not been used for sales for 1 (one) consecutive month without notification; and
  - D. the TDU holder dies.
- (2) No revocation of TDU as intended in paragraph (1). given compensation.
- (3) The TDU revocation letter is signed by the Civil Service Police Unit.



## CHAPTER IX

## GUIDANCE, IMPLEMENTATION AND SUPERVISION

## Article 12

The management, implementation and supervision of street vendors is carried out with the following provisions: a. Tax and Levy collection is carried out by the Regional Financial Agency; b. entrepreneurship development, marketing, business partnerships and sales of merchandise are carried out by the Department of Trade, Cooperatives and Small and Medium Enterprises; c. guidance and supervision of food and drink safety and environment/ sanitation is carried out by Satpol PP in collaboration with the Sukoharjo District Health Service in the form of a Memorandum of Understanding;

d. the tent form was carried out by the Sukoharjo Regency Public Works and Spatial Planning Service; e. Parking and traffic control are carried out by the Department Sukoharjo Regency Transportation;

f. cleanliness and waste are carried out by the Environmental Service; g. clean water is carried out by the Regional Drinking Water Company Sukoharjo Regency;

h. lighting and electricity arrangements are carried out by the Sukoharjo Branch of the State Electricity Company; i. location/ zoning arrangements are carried out by the Sukoharjo Regency Public Works and Spatial Planning Service; and j. Controlling and enforcement of rules is carried out by the Unit Sukoharjo Regency Civil Service Police.

## CHAPTER X

## TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS

## Article 13

- (1) The provisions in Article 3 of Sukoharjo Regent's Regulation Number 26 of 2008 concerning Regulation of Street Vendor Business Places (PKL) do not apply to PKL regulated in this Regent's Regulation.
- (2) Collection of Regional Taxes and Regional Retributions is carried out 1 (one) month after the TDU is issued.
- (3) Street vendors who have been selling on the sidewalks of Jalan Jenderal Sudirman east of the north of the PT Bank Jateng Sukoharjo Branch office up to Dukuh Dompilan or in front of Puri Lestari Housing before this Regent Regulation was promulgated can still carry out their business and are given the prior right to obtain TDU as long as it does not conflict with this Regent's Regulation.



CHAPTER XI  
**CLOSING**

**Article 14**

**This Regent's Regulation comes into force on the date of promulgation.**

**So that everyone is aware, this Regent's Regulation is ordered to be promulgated by placing it in the Regional Gazette of Sukoharjo Regency.**
