SUKOHARJO REGENT,

- Weigh : a. that in the context of increasing access to health services and financing for pregnant, maternity and postpartum women and newborns to competent health care facilities so as to prevent maternal and infant mortality, support for delivery costs for poor pregnant women who do not have National Health Insurance or other health insurance;
- b. that Authorized local government _ increasing access to health services and financing for pregnant, maternity and postpartum women and newborns to competent health care facilities so as to prevent maternal and infant mortality;
- c. that in order to follow up the Regulation of the Minister of Health Number 12 of 2021 concerning Technical Guidelines for the Use of Non-Physical Special Allocation Funds for Health Sector Fiscal Year 202 1 , then the Regional government needs to regulate the provisions regarding the management and utilization of Maternity Guarantee funds by issuing regional regulations in accordance with the applicable regulations;
- d. that based on the considerations as referred to in letter a , letter b and letter c, it is necessary to stipulate a Regent Regulation concerning the Management and Utilization of the Maternity Insurance Fund in Sukoharjo Regency in 2021 ;

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

article 1

In this Regent Regulation, what is meant by:

1. The area is Sukoharjo Regency.

2. The Regent is the Regent of Sukoharjo.
3. The Regional Government is the Regent as an element of the Regional Government organizer who leads the implementation of government affairs which are the authority of the autonomous Region .
4. Maternity Health Service is any activity and/or a series of activities carried out from the time of conception to delivery.
5. Community Health Center, hereinafter referred to as Puskesmas is a service facility good health carry out efforts public health and first-level individual health efforts, with more prioritize promotive and preventive efforts, to achieve the highest degree of public health in the working area .
6. Advanced level referral health services are individual health service efforts that are specialized or sub-specialized which include advanced level outpatient care, advanced level inpatient care, and inpatient care in special care rooms.
7. Emergency services are medical actions needed by emergency patients in an immediate manner to save lives and prevent disability .
8. The health service referral system is the implementation of health services that regulates the delegation of duties and responsibilities of health services on a reciprocal basis, both vertically and horizontally .
9. Medical action is a professional action by a doctor against a patient with the aim of maintaining, improving, restoring health, or eliminating or reducing suffering .
10. Health service facilities, hereinafter abbreviated as fasyankes, are tools and/or places used to organize health service efforts, whether promotive, preventive, curative, or rehabilitative carried out by the central government, regional governments , and / or the community.
11. Health Service Providers are health service providers at the first and advanced levels.
12. Childbirth Guarantee, hereinafter referred to as Jampersal , is in the form of a delivery guarantee fund which is directed to mobilize labor to a competent health care facility so that there is no delay in referring, to carry out early prevention of complications either during pregnancy, childbirth or the puerperium, including services and management of complications in newborns.

13. *Indonesia-Case Based Groups* tariff , hereinafter referred to as INA-CBG tariff, is the amount of claim payment by BPJS Health to Advanced Level Referral Health Facilities for service packages based on disease diagnosis groupings and procedures .
14. *Antenatal Care* , hereinafter abbreviated as ANC, is Maternity Health Service which aims to fulfill the right of every pregnant woman to obtain quality services so that she is able to undergo a healthy pregnancy, give birth safely, and give birth to a healthy and quality baby .
15. The postpartum period is a period that begins a few hours after the birth of the placenta until 6 (six) weeks after giving birth .
16. Newborns called Neonatal are babies aged between 0 (zero) to 28 (twenty eight) days .
17. quality of basic services in the health sector is a measure of the quantity and quality of goods and/or services for basic health needs and harvests according to technical standards in order to live a decent life.

Section 2

The scope of this Regent Regulation includes:

- a. Jampersal goal;
- b. Jampersal Target;
- c. Kind of service;
- d. Health facilities providing services J ampersal;
- e. J ampersal financing/funding ;
- f. Administrative requirements; and
- g. Rights and obligations.

Article 3

Jampersal aims to :

- a. General objective: to increase access to health services for pregnant, maternity and postpartum women and newborns to competent health care facilities .
- b. Special purpose :
 1. increase coverage of deliveries in competent health service facilities;
 2. reduce cases of complications in pregnant women, maternity and postpartum and newborns; and

3. improve the handling of cases of complications in pregnant women, maternity and postpartum as well as newborns.

CHAPTER III
JAMPERSAL TARGET

Article 4

- (1) Jampersal's goals include:
 - a. I am pregnant ;
 - b. maternity mother ;
 - c. postpartum mother ; and/or
 - d. newborn .
- (2) Pregnant women as referred to in paragraph (1) letter a are pregnant women with high risk factors on the basis of medical indications that require *antenatal care referrals* .
- (3) Mothers giving birth as referred to in paragraph (1) letter b are pregnant women in labor n.
- (4) Postpartum mothers as referred to in paragraph (1) letter c are:
 - a. postpartum women with risk factors or complications on the basis of indications that require referral; and
 - b. Puerperal period is maximum up to 42 (forty two) days after delivery.
- (5) Newborn babies as referred to in paragraph (1) letter d are:
 - a. newborns with complications ; _ _ _ and
 - b. later than 28 (twenty eight) days from the birth of the participant's mother .
- (6) Target Jampersal participants as referred to in paragraph (1) are:
 - a. the poor and underprivileged who do not yet have national health insurance/other insurance; and
 - b. is a resident or domiciled in the Region, either having an identity or not having an identity .

CHAPTER IV
KIND OF SERVICE
Article 5

- (1) Types of Jampersal services at Health Facilities include:
- a. outpatient and inpatient *antenatal care (ANC)* referral examinations in hospitals for pregnant women with risk factors/complications for medical indications;
 - b. outpatient and inpatient postpartum referral examinations at the hospital for pregnant women at risk/complications for medical indications;
 - c. services for pregnant women with normal delivery;
 - d. services for pregnant women with complicated delivery;
 - e. services for pregnant women who experience miscarriages;
 - f. services for pregnant women experiencing disturbed *ectopic pregnancy*;
 - g. services for pregnant women with *Mola Hidatidosa* ;
 - h. services for pregnant women *Histrectomy* due to pregnancy and childbirth;
 - i. obstetric cases with complications;
 - j. *s screening Covid-19* for blood checks / *Rapid Test* in pregnant women before delivery;
 - k. services for postpartum mothers with complications; and/or
 - l. services for normal newborns and complications from mothers using Jampersal.
- (2) The type of Jampersal service as referred to in paragraph (1) provided by the Health Facilities is in accordance with the service standards at the Health Facilities.

CHAPTER V
JAMPERSAL SERVICE PROVIDERS
Article 6

Health facilities that can provide Jampersal services consist of:

- a. Health Centers in the Regions;
- b. Main working obstetrics clinic the same as the Regional Health Office; and/or
- c. Hospitals that do work the same as the Regional Health Office.

CHAPTER V I
JAMPERSAL FINANCING/FUNDING

Article 7

- (1) Jampersal funding/funding comes from the Revenue Budget and State Expenditure which is the Non-physical Special Allocation Fund for Health Sector for Fiscal Year 2021 .
- (2) The financing that can be provided by the Jampersal target includes :
 - a. Inpatient services at the Puskesmas;
 - b. Outpatient and inpatient services at the hospital ; and
 - c. Inpatient services at the clinic .
- (3) The financing provided for the J ampersal target as referred to in paragraph (1) letter a is based on the Puskesmas tariff .
- (4) The financing provided for the Jampersal target as referred to in paragraph (1) letter b is based on the INA-CBG tariff .
- (5) The financing provided for the Jampersal target as referred to in paragraph (1) letter c is based on the clinic tariff .

CHAPTER VI I
ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS

Article 8

- (1) Administrative requirements in Jampersal services are met by:
 - a. Public health Office;
 - b. Puskesmas midwives; and
 - c. patient's family.
- (2) The administrative requirements as referred to in paragraph (1) letter a are a letter of guarantee for Jampersal financing to the health facilities providing Jampersal services.
- (3) The administrative requirements as referred to in paragraph (1) letter b must be completed with:
 - a. *form indicators* of high-risk pregnant women;
 - b. *labor screening* indicator form;
 - c. high risk postpartum mother indicator *form* ; and/or
 - d. *indicators of newborns* with complications.

- (4) The administrative requirements as referred to in paragraph (1) letter c must be completed with:
- a. photocopy of identity owned;
 - b. certificate of poverty or incapacity from the Village/Kelurahan Head;
 - c. domicile certificate from the Head of the Neighborhood Association;
 - d. a statement not a participant of the National Health Insurance; and/or
 - e. photocopy of birth certificate from Fasyankes.

CHAPTER VII I

RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS

Part One

Participant's Rights and Obligations

Article 9

- (1) Jampersal Participants entitled :
- a. get services according to the procedures applies in Health Facilities ; and
 - b. receive financial guarantees from the Department of Health .
- (2) Jampersal participants are obliged to :
- a. complete administrative requirements ; and
 - b. comply with service procedures at Health Facilities.

Article 10

Participant Rights Jampersal as referred to in Article 9 is invalid if you want to be treated in a higher class and choose a doctor and type of service not based on medical indications .

The second part

Rights and Responsibilities of Health Center Midwives

Article 11

- (1) The Puskesmas midwife as referred to in Article 8 paragraph (1) letter b who provides Jampersal services has the right to request administrative requirements from the Jampersal target families .

- (2) Puskesmas midwife as referred to in Article 8 paragraph (1) letter b which provides J ampersal services must:
 - a. collect medical administration requirements in accordance with applicable regulations ;
 - b. checking the JKN membership data for the Jampers target, al through *P Care* ; and
 - c. submit the registration of Jampersal targets as referred to in Article 4 to the Health Service .

Part Three

Rights and Responsibilities of the Health Service

Article 1 2

- (1) The Health Service as referred to in Article 8 in implementation of J ampersal has the right to :
 - a. ask for administrative requirements from the Jampersal target families and the Puskesmas Midwife to complete the Jampersal service requirements ;
 - b. provide Recommendations for Maternity Guarantee Financing ; and/or
 - c. refuse to provide a recommendation for a tie if the requirements are not complete.
- (2) The service as referred to in Article 8 that provides Jampersal services must:
 - a. verifying documents or administrative requirements at the J ampersal target ; and
 - b. verify the services provided by the Health Facilities .

Part Four

Rights and Obligations of Service Providers

Article 1 3

- (1) The health service provider as referred to in Article 6 at the Health Facilities has the right to obtain services and operational funds in accordance with the provisions of the statutory regulations .
- (2) Health service providers at the Health Center Health Center, Clinics and Hospitals must:
 - a. provide services according to standards;
 - b. submit invoices/claims; and

- c. submit health service reports in accordance with statutory provisions.

CHAPTER IX

CLOSING

Article 1 4

This Regent Regulation comes into force on the date of promulgation.

In order for everyone to know, ordering the promulgation of this Regent Regulation by placing it in the Sukoharjo Regency Regional Gazette.
